## **HOUSE BILL NO. 1538**

- A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 4.1-01 of the North Dakota
  Century Code, relating to creating a spay and neuter awareness grant-program; to amend and reenact section 4.1-41-19 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the environment and rangeland protection fund; and to provide an appropriation.

  BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:
- SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 4.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 8 Spay and neuter awareness grant program.
  - The commissioner shall create and administer a spay and neuter awareness grant
     program through the environment and rangeland protection fund.
  - 2. The commissioner shall award grants to applicants engaging into:
    - a. PromotingPromote the use of spaying and neutering services in the state; and
  - b. Offering and performing Assist a person performing spaying and neutering services in the state.
- 15 <u>3.2.</u> In consultation with the state veterinarian, the commissioner shall adopt rules in accordance with chapter 28-32 to implement the provisions of this section.
- 17 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 4.1-41-19 of the North Dakota Century Gode is amended and reenacted as follows:

4.1-41-19. Deposit of fees.

The commissioner shall forward all inspection fees, license fees, and registration fees received under this chapter to the state treasurer. The state treasurer shall deposit the first seven hundred twenty-seven thousand five hundred dollars of revenue received from fees received under this chapter each biennium in the environment and rangeland protection fundand any remaining fees in the general fund.

 AWARENESS GRANT PROGRAM - ONE-TIME FUNDING. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the environment and rangeland protection fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the agriculture commissioner for the purpose of creating and administering the spay and neuter awareness grant program under section 1 of this Act, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027. The funding provided in this section is considered a one-time funding item.
