- 4 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
- 5 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
- 6 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from other funds derived from special funds and
- 7 federal funds, to the parks and recreation department for the purpose of defraying the expenses
- 8 of the parks and recreation department and for providing a grant to the International Peace
- 9 Garden, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027, as follows:

SECTION 6. OTHER FUNDS - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND - DEFERRED MAINTENANCE - PARK SYSTEM GRANTS. The other funds line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$27,174,000 from the strategic investment and improvements fund, of which \$12,500,000 is for deferred maintenance at state parks, \$924,000 is for comfort stations at state parks, \$2,500,000 is for state parks technology enhancements, \$1,250,000 is for state parks matching funds, \$7,500,000 is for park system grants, \$1,500,000 is for an international music camp complex revitalization project at the International Peace Garden, and \$1,000,000 is for a sewer system upgrade project at the International Peace Garden. The parks and recreation department may use funding appropriated for deferred maintenance at state parks for the purchase of buildings to replace currently owned buildings that are beyond feasible repair. The parks and recreation department may award park system grants for the construction renovation, or upgrade of outdoor recreational facilities for outdoor activities to be used by children and young adults.

SECTION 7. INTERNATIONAL PEACE GARDEN. The International Peace Garden line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$3,626,329 for projects at the International Peace Garden, which the parks and recreation department may provided only to the extent the funds are matched by the province of Manitoba at a value equal to the United States dollar exchange rate on July 1, 2025.

**SECTION 8. EXEMPTION - UNEXPENDED APPROPRIATIONS.** The following appropriations are not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11 and may be continued into the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027:

 The sum of \$634,126 appropriated from the parks and recreation fund for extraordinary repairs in subdivision 1 of section 1 of chapter 44 of the 2019 Session Laws, continued into the 2021-23 biennium in section 13 of chapter 19 of the 2021 Session Laws, and continued into the 2023-25 biennium in section 9 of chapter 51 of the 2023 Session Laws.

- The sum of \$200,000 appropriated from the general fund for trail lease renewals and construction or purchasing trail easements in subdivision 1 of section 1 of chapter 19 of the 2021 Session Laws and continued into the 2023-25 biennium in section 9 of chapter 51 of the 2023 Session Laws.
- 3. The sum of \$50,000 appropriated from the general fund for the Fort Abraham Lincoln viewshed lease in subdivision 1 of section 1 of chapter 19 of the 2021 Session Laws and continued into the 2023-25 biennium in section 9 of chapter 51 of the 2023 Session Laws for plantings to improve the viewshed.
- 4. The sum of \$10,000,000 appropriated from the federal state fiscal recovery fund for deferred maintenance and capital projects in subsection 9 of section 1 of chapter 550 of the 2021 Special Session Session Laws and continued into the 2023-25 biennium in section 9 of chapter 51 of the 2023 Session Laws.
- 5. The sum of \$5,000,000 appropriated from the state fiscal recovery fund for the grants to local park districts to renovate and upgrade existing facilities in subsection 5 of section 1 of chapter 550 of the 2021 Special Session Session Laws and continued into the 2023-25 biennium in section 9 of chapter 51 of the 2023 Session Laws.
- 6. The sum of \$1,632,800 appropriated from the state fiscal recovery fund and local matching funds for capital project improvements at state parks, subject to the parks and recreation department obtaining matching funds from nonstate sources for each project on a dollar-for-dollar basis in section 7 of chapter 19 of the 2021 Session Laws as amended in section 4 of chapter 548 of the 2021 Special Session Session Laws and continued into the 2023-25 biennium in section 9 of chapter 51 of the 2023 Session Laws.
- 7. The sum of \$7,900,000 appropriated from the state fiscal recovery fund for the deferred maintenance and capital projects in section 6 of chapter 19 of the 2021 Session Laws as amended by section 3 of chapter 548 of the 2021 Special Session Session Laws and continued into the 2023-25 biennium in section 9 of chapter 51 of the 2023 Session Laws.
- The sum of \$800,000 appropriated from the strategic investment and improvements fund for a pavilion construction project at the International Peace Garden in subdivision 1 of section 1 of chapter 51 of the 2023 Session Laws.

1 The sum of \$10,000,000 appropriated from the strategic investment and 2 improvements fund for deferred maintenance and capital projects in subdivision 1 of 3 section 1 of chapter 51 of the 2023 Session Laws. 4 10. The sum of \$3,000,000 appropriated from the strategic investment and improvements 20 fund and local matching funds for state park matching grants subject to the parks and 21 recreation department obtaining matching funds from nonstate sources for each 22 project on a dollar-for-dollar basis in subdivision 1 of section 1 of chapter 51 of the 23 2023 Session Laws. 24 16. The sum of \$2,000,000 appropriated from grant funds from the state water 25 commission for sovereign land grants in subdivision 1 of section 1 of chapter 51 of the 26 2023 Session Laws.

#### House Bill No. 1019 - Other Changes - House Action

This amendment also adds sections:

- · Regarding the use of funding in the new and vacant FTE pool line item.
- Appropriating additional income from federal or other funds that may become available to the Parks and Recreation Department during the 2025-27 biennium.
- Identifying \$27,174,000 appropriated in Section 1 from SIIF, including \$12,500,000 for deferred maintenance, \$924,000 for comfort stations, \$2,500,000 for state parks technology enhancements, \$1,250,000 for state parks matching funds, \$7,500,000 for park system grants, \$1,500,000 for an International Music Camp complex revitalization project, and \$1,000,000 for a sewer system upgrade project at the International Peace Garden. The section authorizes the Parks and Recreation Department to utilize funding for deferred maintenance projects for the purchase of buildings to replace current storage buildings that are beyond feasible repair and provides the department may award park system grants for the construction, renovation, or upgrade of outdoor recreational facilities for outdoor activities to be used by children and young adults..
- To require funding appropriated for the International Peace Garden be matched by the Providence of Manitoba at a value equal to the United States dollar exchange rate on July 1, 2025.

One-time funding of \$10,000,000 is added for grants, including \$7,500,000 from SIIF for park system grants and \$2,500,000 for state park matching grants, of which \$1,250,000 is from SIIF and \$1,250,000 is from local matching funds collected and deposited in the parks and recreation fund.
