

Testimony of Jennifer Feist, Director of Development Valley City-Barnes County Development Corporation Valley City, ND

SB 2018 (In Favor)

On behalf of the Valley City-Barnes County Development Corporation, I am pleased to offer our support of SB 2018 that appropriates funds for the North Dakota Department of Commerce and a transfer to the North Dakota Development Fund. As introduced, SB 2018 included a transfer of \$50 Million to the North Dakota Development Fund, which was reduced to \$30 Million.

I write in support of the \$50 Million transfer to the North Dakota Development Fund and respectfully request funds be appropriated accordingly.

This action is significant and a good investment for several reasons:

- 1. Investments in rural North Dakota are crucial.
- 2. Low interest loans and/or grants for non-primary sector businesses will have a significant impact on Main Street businesses that in turn, support primary sector business growth. The President & CEO of one of our companies said (paraphrasing) Don't every underestimate the value of community support to companies and their growth. We can't do it alone.
- 3. Communities must be competitive so that
 - a. Primary sector companies continue investing in North Dakota thereby deepening their roots here, and
 - b. People choose to live where they work. Excessive commuting and excessive turnover are not acceptable. Valley City simply cannot lose the benefit of our economic development investments.
- 4. Valley City, as a mid-tier community, has made progress. Growth opportunities exist with our primary sector businesses, some of which are John Deere Seeding Valley City, Malach USA (metal fabrication for OEMs), Atos/Eagle Creek Software Services, Drug Plastics & Glass, TRI W-G Inc. (therapeutic and bariatric tables), Force Manufacturing, Boston Scientific/Preventice (remote heart monitoring), Pembina Pipeline/Alliance Pipeline, and NextEra Energy.
- 5. We face other challenges of K-12 school facilities, housing, and job opportunities plus costs of infrastructure, repurposing/renovating buildings, permanent flood protection, and much more.
- 6. Inflationary costs are impacting literally every sector of our community.
- 7. Loan funds are needed for primary sector companies, which drive community growth. The North Dakota Development Fund complements and supports other funding sources.

The North Dakota Development Fund is a major partner that can provide financial resources that are very much needed in Valley City.
