- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the game and fish
- 2 department; and to provide an exemption.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
- 5 as may be necessary, are appropriated from other funds derived from special funds and federal
- 6 funds, to the game and fish department for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the game
- 7 and fish department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027, as

8	transfer funds from the new and vacant FTE pool line item to the salaries and wages line ite	m in
9	accordance with the guidelines and reporting provisions included in House Bill No. 1015, as	
10	approved by the sixty-ninth legislative assembly.	
11	SECTION 4. GRANTS, GIFTS, AND DONATIONS LINE ITEM. The grants, gifts, and	
12	donations line item in section 1 of this Act includes up to \$100,000 received by the game an	d
13	fish department for surface damage, easements, or reclamation on department-owned or	
14	managed properties as a result of mineral exploration and extraction activities.	
15	SECTION 5. MIDTERM CONSERVATION AGREEMENTS. The game and fish departm	ent
16	may spend up to \$2,777,778 from other funds in the land habitat and deer depredation line	item
17	in section 1 of this Act for national fish and wildlife foundation midterm conservation agreem	ents
18	with private landowners. The department shall limit the term of these agreements to a maxim	num
19	of thirty years. The department shall provide buyback provisions after the fifteenth, twentieth	١,
20	and twenty-fifth years of the agreement if the property owner desires to withdraw all or a por	tion
21	of acreage from the lease.	
22	SECTION 6. EXEMPTION - LINE ITEM TRANSFERS. Notwithstanding section 54-16-0	14,
23	the director of the office of management and budget shall transfer up to \$2,000,000 of	
24	appropriation authority between the operating expenses, capital assets, and grants - game a	and
25	fish line items in section 1 of this Act as requested by the game and fish department during to	the
26	biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027. The game and fish department	t
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shall notify the legislative council of any transfers made pursuant to this section.
