1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of 2 water resources; to provide an appropriation to the parks and recreation department; to create 3 and enact a new section to chapter 61-24.6 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the 4 northwest area water supply biota water treatment plant operating fund; to amend and reenact 5 section 61-02-79 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a Bank of North Dakota line of 6 credit; to authorize the state water commission to issue and sell bonds for water projects; to 7 provide legislative intent; to provide for a report; to provide for a study; to provide a continuing 8 appropriation; to provide for a transfer; to provide an exemption; and to declare an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

section 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated from other funds, derived from special funds and federal funds, to the department of water resources for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the department of water resources, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025 period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2027, as follows:

NEW AND VACANT FTE POOL - LIMITATION - TRANSFER REQUEST. The 5 6 department of water resources may not spend funds appropriated in the new and vacant FTE 7 pool line item in section 1 of this Act, but may request the office of management and budget to 8 transfer funds from the new and vacant FTE pool line item to the salaries and wages line item in 9 accordance with the guidelines and reporting provisions included in House Bill No. 1015, as 10 approved by the sixty-ninth legislative assembly. 11 SECTION 4. ADDITIONAL INCOME - APPROPRIATION - REPORT. In addition to the 12 amounts appropriated in section 1 of this Act, any additional amounts in the resources trust fund and water commission fund which become available are appropriated to the department of 13 water resources for the purpose of providing funding for water projects and grants, for the 14 period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2027. Any additional 15 16 amounts in the resources trust fund must be allocated equally between municipal water supply 17 grants and rural water supply grants. Any additional amounts in the water commission fund 18 must be allocated to the project for which the funding was intended. The director of the department of water resources shall report to the legislative management on the use of any 19 20 additional appropriation authority pursuant to this section. SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - 2023-25 BIENNIUM - DEPARTMENT OF WATER 21 **RESOURCES - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND.** There is 22 appropriated out of any moneys in the strategic investment and improvements fund in the state 23 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$10,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be 24 25 necessary, to the department of water resources for the purpose of repaying a Bank of North Dakota line of credit for the water infrastructure revolving loan fund, for the period beginning 26 with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2025. 27 SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT -28 SOVEREIGN LANDS RECREATION USE GRANTS - ONE-TIME FUNDING. There is 29 appropriated from special funds derived from a grant from the state water commission, not 30 otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$2,500,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to 31

1	the parks and recreation department for the purpose of providing grants for developing
2	recreation opportunities on sovereign lands in the state, for the period beginning with the
3	effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2027. An eligible grant recipient must identify \$1
4	of matching funds for each \$1 awarded pursuant to this section. This funding is considered to
5	be a one-time funding item.
6	SECTION 7. SOVEREIGN LANDS RECREATION USE GRANT. The general water line
7	item in section 1 of this Act includes \$2,500,000 from the resources trust fund which the state
8	water commission shall provide as a grant to the parks and recreation department for
9	developing recreation opportunities on sovereign lands in the state, for the period beginning
10	with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2027.
11	SECTION 8. OTHER FUNDS - WATER PROJECTS STABILIZATION FUND. The total
12	other funds line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$42,500,000 from the water projects
13	stabilization fund for water supply grants for the period beginning with the effective date of this
14	Act, and ending June 30, 2027.
15	SECTION 9. DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES DISCRETIONARY FUNDING. The
16	discretionary funding appropriated to the department of water resources in section 1 of this Act
17	or continued in section 22 of this Act may be used as necessary, except for salaries and wages,
18	for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2027.
19	SECTION 10. BOND ISSUANCE AUTHORIZATION - SOUTHWEST PIPELINE PROJECT.
20	The state water commission, in accordance with chapter 61-02, may arrange for up to
21	one hundred million dollars for southwest pipeline projects, declared to be in the public interest,
22	through the issuance of evidences of indebtedness under chapter 61-02, beginning with the
23	effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2027.
24	SECTION 11. TRANSFER - RESOURCES TRUST FUND - WATER INFRASTRUCTURE
25	REVOLVING LOAN FUND. The state treasurer shall transfer \$45,000,000 from the resources
26	trust fund to the water infrastructure revolving loan fund at the Bank of North Dakota for
27	providing loans for water projects, as requested by the director of the department of water
28	resources.
29	SECTION 12. BANK OF NORTH DAKOTA LINE OF CREDIT - WATER
30	INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING LOAN FUND - TRANSFER. The Bank of North Dakota shall
31	extend a line of credit not to exceed \$100,000,000 to the department of water resources to be

Legislative Assembly 1 transferred to the water infrastructure revolving loan fund as requested by the director of the 2 department of water resources to provide local cost-share loans for projects approved by the 3 state water commission pursuant to section 6-09-49.2. The interest rate associated with the line 4 of credit must be the prevailing interest rate charged to North Dakota government entities. The department of water resources shall request a deficiency appropriation from the seventieth 5 6 legislative assembly to repay the line of credit. 7 SECTION 13. AMENDMENT. Section 61-02-79 of the North Dakota Century Code is 8 amended and reenacted as follows: 9 61-02-79. Bank of North Dakota - Line of credit. 10 The Bank of North Dakota shall extend a line of credit not to exceed one hundred 11 milliontwo hundred million dollars at the prevailing interest rate charged to North Dakota 12 government entities. The department of water resources shall repay the line of credit from funds available in the resources trust fund or other funds, as appropriated by the legislative assembly. 13 If the moneys available at the end of each biennium are not sufficient to repay the line of credit. 14 15 the department of water resources shall request from the legislative assembly a deficiency appropriation to repay the line of credit. The department of water resources may access the line 16 17 of credit, as necessary, to provide up to fifty million dollars for the northwest area water supply-

for water projects during the biennium beginning July 1, 2023 2025, and ending June 30, 20252027.

project and up to fifty million dollars for the southwest pipeline project two hundred million dollars

SECTION 14. A new section to chapter 61-24.6 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Biota water treatment plant operating fund - Continuing appropriation.

The biota water treatment plant operating fund is a special fund in the state treasury into which all federal funds received for the operation of the northwest area water supply's biota water treatment plant must be deposited. All moneys in the fund are appropriated to the department of water resources on a continuing basis for operations of the biota water treatment plant.

SECTION 15. STATE WATER COMMISSION - RED RIVER VALLEY WATER SUPPLY PROJECT FUNDING - LEGISLATIVE INTENT. Excluding the funding provided for Red River valley water supply projects prior to the 2023-25 biennium, the state water commission may not

MISSOURI RIVER AND OTHER WATER SYSTEMS - LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the sixty-ninth legislative assembly that the department of water 11 resources continue to support efforts that protect and develop beneficial use of Missouri River 12 13 system water and other available water supply sources. SECTION 20. EXEMPTION - STATE WATER COMMISSION STUDY - REGIONAL WATER 14 15 SYSTEMS GOVERNANCE AND FINANCE - REPORT. During the 2025-26 interim, the state 16 water commission shall study the long-term governance and finance models of select regional water systems in the state. The study must include the operational and organizational aspects 17 of the southwest pipeline project, northwest area water supply project, and Red River valley 18 water supply project. The state water commission is not subject to procurement requirements 19 20 under chapter 54-44 for the purpose of contracting with a consultant for this study and may 21 contract for the study only with an entity that does not receive direct or indirect benefits from any regional, municipal, or rural water system within the state. Funding for the study is included 22 23 in the appropriation in the discretionary funding line item in section 1 of this Act. The state water commission shall report to the legislative management during the 2025-26 interim and to the 24 appropriations committees of the seventieth legislative assembly regarding the status of and 25 any recommendations from the regional water systems governance and finance study. 26 27 SECTION 21. EXEMPTION - STATE WATER COMMISSION STUDY - COST-SHARE 28 POLICY - REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT. During the 2025-26 interim, the state water commission shall study its cost-share policy, including an evaluation of whether projected 29

funding for water projects, in conjunction with the existing cost-share policy, will adequately

address anticipated funding needs for water projects through July 1, 2039. The study must also

1 evaluate the state's financial roll in deferred maintenance or replacement projects and must 2 recommend strategies to address any funding shortfalls identified. The state water commission 3 is not subject to procurement requirements under chapter 54-44 for the purpose of contracting 4 for this study and may contract for the study only with an entity that does not receive direct or 5 indirect benefits from the cost-share program. Funding for the study is included in the 6 appropriation in the discretionary funding line item in section 1 of this Act. The state water 7 commission shall report annually to the legislative management during the 2025-26 interim 8 regarding the status of and any recommendations from the cost-share policy study. 9 SECTION 22. EXEMPTION - LINE ITEM TRANSFERS - REPORT. Notwithstanding section 10 54-16-04, the office of management and budget shall transfer up to \$10,000,000 between the 11 line items, excluding the salaries and wages line item and the new and vacant FTE pool line 12 item, in section 1 of this Act, during the period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and 13 ending June 30, 2027, as requested by the director of the department of water resources. The 14 director of the department of water resources shall report to the legislative management any 15 transfers made pursuant to this section. 16 SECTION 23. EXEMPTION - GRANTS - WATER-RELATED PROJECTS - UNEXPENDED 17 FUNDS - REPORT. Section 54-44.1-11 does not apply to funding appropriated or continued for 18 grants or water-related projects included in the capital assets, water supply - grants, rural water 19 supply - grants, flood control projects, discretionary funding, and general water - grants line 20 items in sections 1, 3, and 21 of chapter 52 of the 2023 Session Laws. Any unexpended 21 obligated and unobligated funds from these appropriations may be continued into the 2025-27 22 biennium. Any funds continued, estimated by the department of water resources to be 23 \$522,500,000, may be expended only for the purpose for which it was originally appropriated. 24 The director of the department of water resources shall report to the legislative management 25 any funding continued pursuant to this section. 26 **SECTION 24. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.

- · Provide language regarding the use of funding in the new and vacant FTE pool line item.
- Appropriate any additional funds available in the resources trust fund to the Department of Water Resources for municipal water supply grants and rural water supply grants.
- Provide a deficiency appropriation from the strategic investment and improvements fund to the Department of Water Resources to repay a line of credit associated with the water infrastructure revolving loan fund.
- Identify \$2.5 million of the amount appropriated from the resources trust fund in the general water line item for a
 grant to the Parks and Recreation Department for sovereign lands recreation use grants.
- Identify \$42.5 million of the amount appropriated in Section 1 is from the water projects stabilization fund.
- Provide that funding in the discretionary funding line item may be used as necessary, except for salaries and wages.
- Provide revenue bond authorization of \$100 million for the Southwest Pipeline Project.
