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# 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
 and enacted as follows:

#### Holocaust education - Report.

- In this section:
- a. "Antisemitism" means a certain perception of Jews, which may be expressed as hatred toward Jews, and may be manifested physically or rheterically toward individuals, property, community institutions, and religious facilities has the same meaning as provided in the working definition of antisemitism adopted by the international holocaust remembrance alliance on May 26, 2016, including contemporary examples of antisemitism and incorporated by reference in presidential executive order number 13899, published on December 11, 2019.
  - b. "Holocaust" means the systematic, bureaucratic, state-sponsored persecution and murder of approximately six million Jews by the Third Reich and its allies and collaborators during World War II.
- c. "Nazi" means the national socialist German workers' party, a political party that
  rose to power in 1933 and governed Germany until 1945.
