PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO FIRST ENGROSSMENT

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the creation of a rural community endowment fund and a rural
- 3 community endowment fund committee; to provide an appropriation for the rural community
- 4 endowment fund; to provide for a transfer; and to provide for a report.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 7 and enacted as follows:
- 8 Rural community endowment fund Rural community endowment fund committee -
- 9 Purpose Limitations Report.
- 1. There is created in the state treasury a special fund known as the rural community
 11 endowment fund, which is a permanent endowment fund under the administration of
 12 the department.
- The rural community endowment fund consists of any moneys transferred to the fund
 by the legislative assembly and any gifts, donations, or bequests received by the
 department for purposes identified in this section. The principal of the fund may not be
- 16 <u>expended. The department shall determine if any gifts, donations, or bequests</u>
- 17 <u>provided for deposit in the fund are considered permanent in nature and to be</u>
- dedicated as principal of the fund in perpetuity or for a term of years, in which case
- only the income earned as a result of the investment of those funds may be expended.
- The department may not expend moneys from the rural community endowment fund

- until the principal of the fund is at least ten million dollars, of which at least five million dollars must be derived from gifts, donations, bequests, or other funding from nonstate sources collected by the department for deposit in the fund.
- 3. Investment of the rural community endowment fund must be under the supervision of the state investment board in accordance with chapter 21-10. Interest earnedInvestment earnings on moneys in the fund must be credited to the fund, which may be spent by the department, pursuant to legislative appropriations, for providing grants in accordance with this section to rural communities in the state to support, create, or improve local housing, workforce, business recruitment and commerce, infrastructure, or other community needs. Funding may not be provided for operating funds of a local entity.
- 4. The commissioner shall appoint a rural community endowment fund committee consisting of the commissioner, nine individuals residing in rural communities, and a representative of a nonprofit organization dedicated to supporting housing initiatives—social and cultural events, and small businesses inthat are critical to the vitality of rural communities efin the state. Of the nine individuals residing in rural communities, five individuals must be appointed for a term of two years and four individuals must be appointed for an initial term of one year. Thereafter, the four individuals must be appointed for two-year terms. Terms shall commence on September first of the year of appointment. The commissioner shall serve as the chairman of the committee.
- 5. The rural community endowment fund committee shall award grants from the rural community endowment fund. When awarding grants from the fund, the committee shall prioritize capital projects that support the long-term prosperity, independence, safety, health, and quality of life of rural communities and their citizens. The committee shall determine funding application and evaluation processes, including grant award amounts and recipients, priority of projects, and evaluation criteria of approved projects.
- 6. The department shall contract with a nonprofit organization dedicated to supporting housing initiatives, social and cultural events, and small businesses of vital community importance in rural communities in the state to assist the department in administering the rural community endowment fund and provide recommendations to the rural

1		community endowment fund committee related to funding, awards, projects, and other				
2		purposes. The department may expend up to ten percent of funding available for				
3		distribution in the rural community endowment fund for costs of administering the				
4		program.				
5	<u>7.</u>	For purposes of this section, "rural community" means a city with a population of fewer				
6		than one thousand two hundred individuals as determined by the most recent				
7		decennial census.				
8	<u>8.</u>	Before July first of each year, the department shall report to the legislative				
9		management regarding the status of the rural community endowment fund, use of				
10		funding, and program results. The department shall provide an additional status report				
11		to each appropriations committee during regular legislative sessions.				
12	SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER TO RURAL COMMUNITY ENDOWMENT					
13	FUND - ONE-TIME FUNDING. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in					
14	the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$5,000,000, which the office of					
15	management and budget shall transfer to the rural community endowment fund, during the					
16	biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027. The appropriation in this section is					
17	considered a one-time funding item.
