PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SECOND ENGROSSMENT

REENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1524

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-40.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the funding of regional planning councils; and to provide an
- 3 appropriation for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota
- 4 Century Code, relating regional planning council grants from the department of commerce.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 54-40.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 6 and enacted as follows: 7 Biennial work plan - Funding. 8 9 A regional council shall prepare a biennial work plan. The work plan must: Include proposed actions, targeted outcomes, and an itemized budget. 10 Align with the comprehensive economic development strategy for the region 11 developed with input from regional stakeholders, including members of the 12 13 legislative assembly. Be approved by the regional council's executive board before submission. 14 Address issues of rural capacity, including business development, zoning and 15 land use planning, grant writing and technical assistance, housing development, 16 child care support, workforce development, infrastructure planning, tourism and 17 placemaking initiatives, disaster recovery planning, and community leadership 18 19 development.

1	2. A regional council shall submit:		
2	a. Copies of the biennial work plan no later than twelve months before the		
3	beginning of each biennium to the commissioner of the department of commerce.		
4	the governor, and members of the legislative assembly representing the region. A		
5	county providing financial support to regional councils shall maintain or exceed		
6	the funding to ensure the continuation of regional development efforts.		
7	b. Reporting metrics detailing program outcomes, expenditures, and other relevant		
8	performance measures no later than forty-five days before the end of the		
9	biennium to the commissioner of the department of commerce, the governor, and		
10	members of the legislative assembly representing the region.		
11	3. Subject to legislative appropriations, the department of commerce shall provide		
12	funding to regional councils to implement the biennial work plan.		
13	— 4. Funds may:		
14	a. Be used to employ individuals or for contractual services to implement the		
15	biennial work plan under this section.		
16	b. Not be used for debt repayment, loans, grants, lobbying, political activities, or		
17	unrelated or nonessential expenses, including entertainment, luxury purchases,		
18	or projects that do not demonstrate a regional benefit.		
19	5. Fifty percent of appropriated funding must be allocated equally among the eight		
20	regions and fifty percent must be awarded based on a funding formula established		
21	jointly by the department of commerce and the association of regional councils.		
22	6. The funding formula under subsection 5 must be reviewed and amended as necessary		
23	every four years and provide equitable allocation of funding for a regional council		
24	providing services for multiple service areas or counties.		
25	SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE - REGIONAL		
26	GOUNCILS. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury,		
27	not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$2,400,000, or so much of the sum as may be		
28	necessary, to the department of commerce for the purpose of funding regional planning		
29	councils, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027.		
30	SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota Century Code is created		
31	and enacted as follows:		

Regional planning council grants - Purpose.

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The department may award grants to regional planning councils under chapter 54-40.1 to support local and regional implementation of state-authorized programs and initiatives, including housing, regional workforce, rural catalyst, local food and grocery, and other state authorized programs, subject to legislative appropriations. The department may approve grants to support program implementation, resource development, and efforts to attract and leverage public or private investment in local and regional areas of the state.

Provisions included in the House version are removed and replaced with a new section added to North Dakota Century Code Chapter 54-60 to allow the Department of Commerce to award grants to regional planning councils, subject to legislative appropriations.
