- A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-06 of the North Dakota

 Century Code, relating to policies for student cellular telephone use: for an Act to create and

 enact a new section to chapter 15.1-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the use of

 personal electronic devices during instructional time.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6	SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created		
7	and enacted as follows:		
8	— <u>Cellular telephone usage policy.</u>		
9	<u> 1. A</u>	s used in this section:	
10	<u>a</u>	"Cellular telephone" means a wireless communication device, which is capable of	
11		transmitting voice, text, or data between parties. The term does not include a	
12		tablet, laptop computer, or personal computer approved by the school district for	
13		educational use.	
14	<u> </u>	"Instructional time" means the time when a student is attending class or an	
15		educational activity.	
16	<u>C.</u>	"Noninstructional time" means the time when a student is not attending class or	
17		an educational activity, including lunch, recess, time between classes, the time	
18		before a student's first class and after a student's last class, and open class-	
19		periods.	

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1	2. A board of a school district shall adopt a policy governing the use of cellular				
2	telephones during instructional and noninstructional time.				
3	3. A policy:				
4	a. May include time and location restrictions for cellular telephone usage, limitations				
5	regarding disruptions, proper instructional use, acceptable and unacceptable use				
6	of cellular telephones for students and staff, and disciplinary actions for student				
7	noncompliance.				
8	<u>b. Must include exceptions for:</u>				
9	(1) Medical accommodations. An individual may use a cellular telephone or				
10	other technological device, if required for accommodations based on a				
11	disability or management of a medical condition, including continuous				
12	glucose monitoring or seizure alerts. The individual shall provide to the				
13	school administrator relevant documentation from a licensed health care				
14	provider.				
15	(2) Educational accommodations. A student with an individual education				
16	program, individual learning plan, a plan under section 504 of the				
17	Rehabilitation Act of 1973 [29 U.S.C. 794], or other plan under the law must				
18	be accommodated according to the plan.				
19	(3) Emergency situations affecting the health, safety, or well-being of a student				
20	or staff member.				
21	SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15.1-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created				
22	and enacted as follows:				
23	Personal electronic devices - Prohibition during instructional time.				
24	1. As used in this section:				
25	a. "Instructional time" means the time from the start of the school day until dismissal				
26	at the end of the school day, for which the signal may be the ringing of a bell.				
27	including a structured or unstructured learning experience, recess, a lunch				
28	period, time in between classes, and a field trip.				
29	b. "Parent" means a parent or guardian of a student who is authorized to make				
30	decisions regarding education for the student.				

1	c. "Personal electronic communication device" means a portable e	electronic device	
2	2 capable of communication by voice, text, or other data with one	or more other	
3	parties or devices, or capable of connection to a smartphone, the	ne internet, or a	
4	cellular or wireless fidelity network, including a smartphone, cell phone,		
5	5 <u>bluetooth-enabled device, tablet, smartwatch or other wearable</u>	device, and	
6	6 gaming device. The term does not include:		
7	7 (1) School-owned devices provided to a student in accordance	e with this section.	
8	8 (2) Portable devices that meet the definition of a medical devi	ce under the	
9	9 federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act [21 U.S.C. 9 et seq.]		
10	d. "School" means a public school, education center, charter school	ol, or training	
11	program. providing prekindergarten, elementary, or secondary e	education.	
12	e. "School-related activity" means a school sanctioned activity, eve	ent, or function.	
13	occurring outside of instructional time, at which students are un	der supervision of	
14	the school, whether on or off school premises, including a bus r	ide, field trip.

16	f. "Student" means an individual currently enrolled or registered a	t a school.	
17	2. Each school district or applicable governing body shall adopt and im-	plement a policy	
18	for schools which:		
19	a. Requires all personal electronic communication devices be turn	ed off, securely	
20	locked away, and inaccessible to students during instructional ti	me;	
21	b. Ensures students do not have access to personal electronic cor	nmunication	
22	devices, by requiring the devices to be locked or stowed away in	n a secure	
23	lockable pouch, phone locker, pencil pouch, manila envelope, o	r other	
24	inaccessible location:		
25	c. Provides schools may limit student access to personal electronic	c communication	
26	devices outside of instructional time, during a school-related act	ivity:	
27	d. Includes enforcement provisions to ensure strict compliance wit	h the policy by	
28	students and school employees; and		
29	e. Provides a student may contact the student's parent or caregive	er during the	
30	school day if needed by using a school telephone made availab	le to the student	
31	in a manner and location designated by the school.		

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Notwithstanding subsection 2, a school may not prohibit a student from possessing or 1 2 using a personal electronic communication device, if: A licensed medical provider determines the possession or use of a personal 3 electronic communication device is necessary for the health or well-being of the 4 5 student; or The possession or use of a personal electronic communication device is required 6 7 by the student's individual education program or plan under section 504 of the 8 federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973 [29 U.S.C. 794]. A school district shall collect data annually to measure the impact of its policy on 9 student behavior, mental health, disciplinary incidents, school attendance, and 10 11 academic performance.
