§ 1. APPROPRIATION.] There is hereby appropriated out of the Bee License Fund in the State Treasury, the sum of \$2,500.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary to defray the expenses of the Commissioner of Agriculture and Labor or his agents as provided for in Chap. 2, S. L. 1939, for the biennium beginning July 1st, 1943, and ending June 30th, 1945, to-wit:

CHAPTER 8

S. B. No. 162—(Schrock and Thatcher)

ARMORIES, AT CARRINGTON AND BOTTINEAU

An Act making an Appropriation of \$5,000.00 each for the completion of the Armories at Carrington, North Dakota, and Bottineau, North Dakota, and providing for the manner of disbursing said funds, and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota:

§ 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$5,000.00 to be used as herein provided for the assistance in completion of the Armory of Company F, of the 164th Infantry at Carrington, North Dakota, to be disbursed as herein provided.

§ 2. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$5,000.00 to be used as herein provided for the assistance in completion of the Armory of the Medical Detachment, 164th Infantry, at Bottineau, North Dakota, to be disbursed as herein provided.

§ 3. The appropriations made in Sections 1 and 2 of this Act shall be disbursed by, and under the direction of the State Board of Armory Supervisors of North Dakota, for such items as they shall deem proper for the purpose of completing the aforementioned armories, and shall be disbursed upon vouchers submitted and approved by the said Board.

§ 4. EMERGENCY.] This Act is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

Approved March 17, 1943.

CHAPTER 9

H. B. No. 3—(Committee on Appropriations)

ARREST AND RETURN OF FUGITIVES FROM JUSTICE

An Act making an appropriation to provide funds for the arrest and return of fugitives from justice.

Be It Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota:

§ I. APPROPRIATION.] There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the State Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$5,000.00, or so much thereof, as may be necessary for the biennium beginning July 1st, 1943, and ending June 30th, 1945, to provide funds for the arrest and return of fugitives from justice as provided by Section 11162, Compiled Laws of 1913, as amended and re-enacted by Chapter 160, Laws of 1915, the same being Section 11162 of the Supplement to the 1913 Compiled Laws of North Dakota.

ATTORNEY GENERAL—LICENSING DEPARTMENT

An Act making an appropriation for the enforcement and administration of the Attorney General Licensing Department.

Be It Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota:

§ I. APPROPRIATION.] There is hereby appropriated out of the Attorney General License Fund in the State Treasury, the sum of \$27,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary for salaries and general expenses for the Attorney General Licensing Department as provided for in Sec. 11, Chap. 258, S. L. 1939, for the biennium beginning July 1st, 1943, and ending June 30th, 1945, to-wit:

CHAPTER 12

H.B. No. 31—(Committee on Appropriations)

BOYS' AND GIRLS' CLUB WORK

An Act making an appropriation for the payment of the premiums for Boys' and Girls' Club Work at County Achievement Fairs; and providing the manner of disbursing such funds and making reports.

Be It Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota:

§ 1. APPROPRIATION.] There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the State Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of not to exceed \$100.00 each year to each organized county of the state in which a Boys' and Girls' Achievement Day, or Achievement Fair, is conducted, which sum shall be used exclusively for the payment of premiums for Boys' and Girls' Club Work.

§ 2. HOW PAID.] The moneys so appropriated shall be paid to the County Agent of each county conducting a Boys' and Girls' Achievement Day, or Achievement Fair, upon a voucher duly executed by the County Agent and filed with the State Auditor, stating that the money is to be used for the purpose herein authorized. Within thirty days following the Boys' and Girls' Achievement Day, or Achievement Fair, the County Agent shall file with the Governor of the State a full and complete itemized statement showing the disposition of the premium payments, and any balance not expended shall be remitted to the State Treasurer and placed to the credit of the General Fund.

CHAPTER 13

S. B. No. 2—(Committee on Appropriations)

BUDGET

An Act to appropriate money for the expenses of the executive, legislative and judicial departments of the State Government, and for all of the sub-divisions thereof, and for public schools, specifying the amount and time for which such appropriations shall be available, and repealing all acts, or parts of acts, insofar as the same shall relate to appropriations conflicting herewith or to appropriations for the same matters or purposes provided for herein, and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota:

§ 1. APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE EXECUTIVE, LEGISLATIVE, AND JUDICIAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT, AND FOR ALL OF THE SUBDIVISIONS THEREOF, AND FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS.] The sums hereinafter named only or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the State Treasury, to the credit of each department, sub-division and public schools hereinafter named and the balance necessary out of the General Fund, except as hereinafter specifically provided, not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose specified in the following sections of this Act.

§ 2. THE PERIOD DURING WHICH THE APPROPRIATIONS MADE HEREIN SHALL BE AVAILABLE.] Unless otherwise specifically stated, the appropriations herein made shall be available for the expenses to be incurred in and about the several purposes herein set out, during the fiscal period of two years, beginning July 1st, 1943, and ending June 30th, 1945.

§ 4. Appropriations herein provided insofar as they are used for postage may be expended only on the direction of the Board of Administration, pursuant to the rules and regulations provided for in Chapter 214, Session Laws of 1941.

§ 5. INTENT, REPEAL, PURPOSE AND CONSTRUCTION.] All acts and parts of acts that may be in conflict herewith are hereby repealed and if for any reason or cause any specific appropriation for any item or set of items should be held by the court, or courts, to be unconstitutional or illegal or otherwise unavailable for any cause, such holding shall not affect or be construed to apply to the remaining items of appropriation herein or purposes provided for herein.

§ 6. EMERGENCY.] This Act is necessary to the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety. The reason for this is that it contains the general appropriation and provides the means of continuing and maintaining the State Government and to enable it to perform its proper functions, among which are the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the people, and without the means provided for by this Act the functions of the State Government will be suspended. This Act will therefore in its entirety go into instant operation upon its approval by the Governor.

CODE REVISION

An Act to Provide for the Completion of Code Revision by the Code Revision Commission, Reappropriating Moneys Heretofore Appropriated, Making an Additional Appropriation and Declaring an Emergency.

Be It Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota:

§ 1. § 3. **ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION.]** In addition to the amounts reappropriated by Section 2 of this act, there is hereby appropriated out of the moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of eighteen thousand dollars (\$18,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, to complete the work of code revision as provided in Chapter 110 of the Session Laws of 1939 and Chapter 32 of the Session Laws of 1941. Such appropriation shall be available for use to defray any necessary expenses incident to code revision and shall be available from and after the passage and approval of this act.

§ 4. **DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS.]** The moneys hereby appropriated and reappropriated to the code revision fund and to the use of the Code Revision Commission shall be disbursed upon vouchers approved by a member of such commission and by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court.

§ 5. **EMERGENCY.]** Whereas, the work of code revision is being prosecuted to the end that it may be completed as promptly as may be after the adjournment of the twenty-eighth legislative assembly, and the code revision fund is nearly exhausted, and it is necessary that the functions of the Code Revision Commission be uninterrupted, therefore it is hereby declared that an emergency exists and that this act shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

Be It Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota:

§ I. APPROPRIATION.] There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the State Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$3,000.00, or so much thereof as is necessary, to the North Dakota Firemen's Association, for use in promoting regional fire schools, and other activities of such association, as provided for in Chapter 137, Session Laws of 1935, for the biennium beginning July 1st, 1943, and ending June 30th, 1945.

CHAPTER 35

H. B. No. 2—(Committee on Appropriations)

NORTH DAKOTA SOLDIERS' HOME

An Act making an appropriation for the North Dakota Soldiers' Home at Lisbon, North Dakota: providing for reports and deductions.

Be It Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota:

§ 1. APPROPRIATION.] There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the State Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$8,975.00, and such moneys as may come to the Interest and Income and Federal Aid funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary not to exceed \$44,000.00, for the biennium beginning July 1st, 1943, and ending June 30th, 1945, or so much thereof as may be necessary for the maintenance and support of the North Dakota Soldiers' Home located at Lisbon, North Dakota, said sum to be paid as follows: one quarter of \$13,243.75 to be payable July 1st, 1943 and each additional quarter to be payable at the end of each succeeding six months thereafter.

§ 2. REPORTS AND CERTIFICATES, PAYMENTS.] The superintendent in charge of said home shall make semi-annual reports to the State Auditor of the State of North Dakota, duly certified under oath, showing the amount of money remaining unexpended and estimating the amount of money which shall be required for the succeeding six months, and, if it shall appear from said report and estimate that the full amount appropriated for the succeeding six months exceeds the amount of the estimate, then the amount to be paid shall be reduced to the amount of said estimate.

CHAPTER 36

S. B. No. 34—(Committee on Appropriations)

NORTH DAKOTA STATE FARM

An Act to amend and re-enact Sections 3, 4, 7, 8, 9 and 10 of Chapter 229, of the Session Laws of 1941, relating to the North Dakota State Farm, and making an appropriation therefor.

Be It Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota:

§ 1. AMENDMENT.] That Section 3, of Chapter 229, of the 1941 Session Laws is hereby amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

§ 3. So far as it may be possible to so do, such buildings and equipment shall be utilized for the establishment and operation of said Farm. The board shall have authority to make such use and disposal of such buildings and equipment as they find necessary to facilitate the operation of said farm, and the employment of persons who have been or may be committed thereto; and to that end the board may cause such buildings and equipment to be moved to other locations on lands under the control of said board and used in the operation of said farm, or in the farming operations of the Penitentiary. The board may utilize any of such buildings or any of such equipment, that is not needed and cannot be used profitably in the establishment and operation of such farm, at the Penitentiary or at the State Training School, and generally make such disposal and use of such buildings and equipment as shall prevent loss and waste, and result in public benefit.

§ 2. AMENDMENT.] That Section 4 of Chapter 229, of the 1941 Session Laws is hereby amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

§ 4. The said Board shall have charge and control of said Farm, and of all property which said Board has received or acquired, or may hereafter receive or acquire, incident to or for the establishment and operation of said Farm. For administrative and operational purposes the said Farm shall be deemed a facility of the State Penitentiary, and shall be operated in connection therewith. The Warden of the Penitentiary shall be the superintendent or chief administrative officer of the Farm. Machinery, equipment, livestock and other property of the Penitentiary and of the Farm may be used interchangeably. The Board may employ such help as may be necessary, and as available funds will permit, and prescribe their duties and fix their compensation. The Board may assign to said farm in any capacity, persons employed in connection with the operation of the State Penitentiary. Such person or persons may be assigned either for full time or part time work, and, in the judgment of the Board,

the compensation of such persons may be continued to be paid and charged as it was before they were assigned to work at said State Farm. Until the said Farm has been put into operation, all properties that have been received and acquired by the said Board for the establishment and operation of said Farm may be utilized in carrying on the operations of the State Penitentiary.

§ 3. AMENDMENT.] That Section 7 of Chapter 229 of the 1941 Session Laws is hereby amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

§ 7. The cost of transporting persons committed to the State Farm shall be paid as the costs of transporting persons committed to the State's Penitentiary are paid. The cost of care and keep of persons who are committed to the State Farm for the commission of a crime for which they might have been sentenced to the Penitentiary shall be paid by the State out of the funds appropriated for such purpose for persons committed to the State Penitentiary, or out of the funds appropriated in this act. The cost of care and keep of persons committed to said farm for the commission of a crime for which they might have been sentenced to a county jail, but, might not have been sentenced to the State Penitentiary, shall be paid by the county from which such person is committed at the rate of \$1.00 per day per person.

The Board shall have authority to enter into an arrangement or agreement with the proper authorities of the Federal Government, whereby persons convicted of a crime in the Federal Court of this State may be committed to said Farm. Provided, however, that persons convicted in the Federal Court shall be committed and admissible to the said Farm only if the term of sentence is not less than 30 days nor more than one year.

§ 4. AMENDMENT.] That Section 8 of Chapter 229 of the 1941 Session Laws be amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

§ 8. Whenever such Farm shall have been equipped with facilities sufficient to be put into operation, the Board shall notify the judges of the district court and of the county courts with increased jurisdiction that such Farm is ready to receive prisoners. Thereafter, the judges of the district courts, and of the county courts with increased jurisdiction, may commit thereto, so far as the capacity of the Farm shall permit, all male persons who otherwise would be committed to the County Jail or to the State Penitentiary for violation of any criminal law of this state, where the sentence is not less than thirty (30) days nor more than one year. A person committed to the State Work Farm shall not be deemed to have been convicted of a felony, but shall be deemed to have been convicted of a misdemeanor.

§ 5. AMENDMENT.] That Section 9 of Chapter 229 of the 1941 Session Laws be amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

§ 9. The laws relating to compensation, the merit system, good time and extra good time, and the imposition of penalties for misconduct provided by law for persons imprisoned in the State Penitentiary, shall be applicable to persons committed to the State Work Farm, except in so far as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this Act. Where a person who has been committed to the Farm conducts himself in such manner as to interfere with the operation of the farm, or with the welfare or safety of others, and where in the judgment of the board the best interests of such person or the best interests and welfare of other persons committed to the farm so require, the board may direct that such person be removed from the farm and placed in the State Penitentiary. The board, may, also, direct that persons who have been sentenced to the penitentiary be transferred to the Farm, when such action seems desirable and in the best interest of the person so transferred, and in no manner detrimental to the welfare of other persons that have been committed to the said Farm.

The board may cause persons committed to the said Farm to be assigned for work incident to the operations of the penitentiary, or of any other institution under the control of the said Board.

§ 6. AMENDMENT.] That Section 10 of Chapter 229, of the 1941 Session Laws, be amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

§ 10. There is hereby appropriated the sum of Fifty Thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) out of the State Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to pay for the establishment, and operation of said Farm, and the maintenance of the persons committed thereto, for the biennium beginning July 1st, 1943, and ending June 30th, 1945. There is, also, hereby appropriated for the same purposes all moneys received from counties and from the Federal Government under Section 3 of this Act, during said biennium.

NATIONAL DELEGATES

An Act making an appropriation to defray expenses of the delegates to National Political Conventions as prescribed by Section 916 of the Compiled Laws of 1913.

Be It Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota:

§ I. APPROPRIATION.] There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$3,200.00 for the biennium, or so much thereof as may be necessary to pay the traveling expenses of delegates to national nominative political conventions as prescribed by Section 916 of the Compiled Laws of North Dakota for the year 1913.

OLEOMARGARINE STAMPS

An Act Making an Appropriation for the Purpose of Paying for Oleomargarine Stamps.

APPROPRIATION.] There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the State Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$500.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary for the purpose of paying for oleomargarine stamps as provided for under Chapter 211 of the session laws of 1931 for the State of North Dakota.

PENSION MINOR CHILDREN OF JOHN CRITES

An Act Making an Appropriation for a Pension for Patricia Ann Crites and Dennis Duane Crites, minor children of National Guardsman John E. Crites.

There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of five hundred and twenty-eight dollars (\$528.00) or so much thereof as may be found necessary for paying a pension to Patricia Ann Crites and Dennis Duane Crites, minor children of John E. Crites, in accordance with Section 2423 of the Compiled Laws of 1913, and for the reason that Private John E. Crites of the North Dakota National Guard, died from a gunshot wound accidentally received while in the performance of his duties as a National Guardsman, during the month of June, 1935, said appropriation to cover pension of twenty-two dollars (\$22.00) per month from July 1, 1943 to July 1, 1945.

An Act making an appropriation for the biennium beginning July 1st, 1943, and ending June 30, 1945, for disbursement by the Public Welfare Board in providing public assistance to the dependent children and to needy blind and providing child welfare services and services to crippled children and for necessary costs of administration.

Be It Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota:

§ 1. APPROPRIATION.] There is hereby appropriated for the biennium beginning July 1st, 1943, and ending June 30th, 1945, out of any moneys in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,266,120.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be expended by the Public Welfare Board in providing public assistance for the dependent children and for needy blind as provided by Chapter 243 of the Session Laws of 1941 and Chapter 210 of the Session Laws of 1937, as amended and for child welfare services and services to crippled children as provided by Chapter 221 of the Session Laws of 1935, and Chapter 242 of the Session Laws of 1941 in carrying out and effectuating such programs in coordination with and supplementary to funds made available for like purposes in North Dakota by the Federal Government, and in payment of the costs of administration of each of these programs.

§ 2. AID TO DEPENDENT CHILDREN.] Of the amount so appropriated, the sum of \$1,077,000.00 or so much thereof as may be necessary, may be disbursed for the purpose of providing aid to dependent children as provided by Chapter 243 of the Session Laws of 1941.

§ 3. AID TO NEEDY BLIND.] Of the amount so appropriated, the sum of \$62,605.00 or so much thereof as may be necessary, may be disbursed for the purpose of providing aid to the needy blind as provided by Chapter 210 of the Session Laws of 1937, as amended.

§ 4. CHILD WELFARE SERVICES.] Of the amount so appropriated, the sum of \$43,375.00 or so much thereof as may be necessary, may be disbursed for the purpose of providing for child welfare services as provided by Chapter 221 of the Session Laws of 1935.

§ 5. SERVICES TO CRIPPLED CHILDREN.] Of the amount so appropriated, the sum of \$83,140.00 or so much thereof as may be necessary, may be disbursed for the purpose of providing services

to crippled children as provided by Chapter 221 of the Session Laws of 1935, and Chapter 242 of the Session Laws of 1941.

§ 6. ADMINISTRATION.] Of the total sum of \$1,266,120.00, hereby appropriated to provide for the four programs above named, the sum of \$73,705.00 or so much thereof as may be necessary for efficient administration, may be used by the Public Welfare Board for the costs of administration of such four programs, as herein itemized, viz:

PUBLIC WELFARE—GENERAL ASSISTANCE

An Act making an appropriation for relief to destitute and necessitous persons for the biennium beginning July 1st, 1943, and ending June 30th, 1945, defining the powers and duties of the Public Welfare Board in relation thereto, and in providing for allocation of funds to counties for relief purposes and for other specified relief expenditures and costs of administration.

Be It Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota:

§ I. APPROPRIATION.] There is hereby appropriated for the biennium beginning July 1st, 1943, and ending June 30th, 1945, out of any moneys in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$450,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary for the purpose of carrying out and effectuating the purposes of this Act.

§ 2. PURPOSES.] Disbursements under this Act are made for the purpose of relieving the distress of destitute and necessitous persons and their families and dependents by furnishing them with means of support compatible with decency and health, and also in carrying out the provisions of Chapter 221 of the Session Laws of 1935.

The Public Welfare Board is hereby authorized to make distribution from the amount herein appropriated for relief to destitute and necessitous persons among the county governments of North Dakota from month to month, after taking into consideration the number of relief cases to be cared for, the ability of each county to finance the costs of necessary relief, and other facts which, in the opinion of the Public Welfare Board, should be taken into account in order to do justice and equity among the counties, also to pay for institutional care for indigent unmarried mothers and for the care of transients having state but not county residence.

§ 3. ADMINISTRATION.] Of the sum of \$450,000.00 hereby appropriated, the sum of \$47,700.00 or so much thereof as may be necessary, may be used by the Public Welfare Board for the costs of administration which shall include the cost of supervision of the referral, certification, and selection of persons to the Farm Security Administration & National Youth Administration which are now, except for referral, certification and selection, entirely financed by Federal funds; and in the supervision of any other relief program which may hereafter be devised by the Federal Government and which may be entirely financed by Federal funds; as herein itemized, viz:

Whereas, the Baptist Old Peoples' Home, a North Dakota Corporation, owns a tract of land two hundred forty feet from east and west and three hundred sixty-three feet north to south, abutting upon the Capitol grounds; and

Whereas, said corporation intends to build and erect upon its said tract in the near future an old peoples' home, to accommodate some sixty or more aged people under its care, at a cost of at least thirty-five thousand dollars; and

Whereas, it would detract from the aesthetic surroundings of such a home to have the State-owned tract herein referred to used for commercial purposes;

Now, Therefore:

Be It Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota:

§ 1. The Board of Administration of the State of North Dakota is hereby authorized to sell and convey to Baptist Old Peoples' Home, a North Dakota corporation, the following described real property, to-wit:

All of Block Thirty-six (36), of Capitol Park Addition to the Townsite of Bismarck, North Dakota, except lots one (1) and two (2) and thirty-one (31) and thirty-two (32) and the North fifteen (15) feet of Lots three (3) and thirty (30) of said Block Thirty-six (36) for the consideration of One dollar (\$1.00), and other sufficient consideration.

§2. The conveyance by which said tract is conveyed to said corporation shall contain the provision that said property shall be used solely in connection with and for the purpose of a home for the aged under the care of said corporation, and that if said tract is not used for such purpose, within five years after this act becomes effective, or, if said property shall ever cease to be used for said purpose, the title to said property so conveyed shall revert to and be reinvested in the State of North Dakota.
