FRANK ALBERS, who served in the Thirtieth and Thirty-first Legislative Assemblies, from the forty-eighth district, died October 31, 1974.

AMOS FREED, who served in the Thirty-first through Thirty-sixth Legislative Assemblies, from the thirty-first district, died July 7, 1976.

SELMER GILBERTSON, who served in the Thirty-fourth through the Thirty-seventh Legislative Assemblies, from the thirty-eighth district, died March 14, 1976.

C. G. KEE, who served in the Thirty-fifth through the Thirty-eighth Legislative Assemblies, from the twenty-fifth district, died June 25, 1976.

ANTON LAVIK, who served in the Twenty-fifth through the Twenty-eighth Legislative Assemblies, from the thirteenth district, died September 23, 1975.

EDWARD LIAN, who served in the Twenty-fifth and Twenty-sixth Legislative Assemblies, from the third district, died December 12, 1976.

HALVOR ROLFSRUD, who served in the Thirty-ninth Legislative Assembly, from the forty-first district, died April 1, 1976.

LAVERN SCHOEDER, who served in the Thirty-first through the Thirty-fourth Legislative Assemblies, from the forty-ninth district, died March 16, 1976.

ALOYS WARTNER, who served in the Thirty-fifth through the Thirty-eighth Legislative Assemblies, from the thirty-third district, died June 7, 1976.

WHEREAS, today, we, as members of the Senate of the Forty-fifth Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota, pause to mourn the passing of our former colleagues, and to honor their memories; and

WHEREAS, these legislators rendered outstanding service to the people of the state by their contribution to their fellowmen and their communities;
