¹ The House amended the bill to provide that the separate and additional one percent tax on lodging is to be deposited into the state general fund and to provide a \$2.9 million general fund appropriation to the Department of Commerce Division of Tourism for the

purpose of defraying the expenses of out-of-state marketing relating to the Lewis and Clark Bicentennial celebration. The amount spent may not exceed the amount of revenue generated from the separate and additional tax imposed by the bill.
