Item Description

Full-time equivalent changes - The Legislative Assembly approved 3 FTE positions for the Ethics Commission for the 2023-25 biennium, an increase of 2 FTE positions from the 2021-23 biennium. The Legislative Assembly added 1 FTE education and training position and converted a temporary position to a 1 FTE executive assistant position.

New and vacant FTE funding pool - The Legislative Assembly reduced \$71,907 of 2023-25 biennium general fund appropriation authority for the Ethics Commission for new (\$60,798) and vacant (\$11,109) positions for the new and vacant FTE funding pool.

One-time funding - The Legislative Assembly appropriated the following one-time funding for the 2023-25 biennium:

Status/Result

The status of the new FTE positions is shown below:

- The executive assistant position was filled in September 2023.
- The training and education position was filled as a general counsel position in September 2023. In addition to serving as general counsel, the position will also coordinate educational opportunities.

The Ethics Commission has received \$60,798 from the new and vacant FTE funding pool to fill 1 new FTE position. Through January 2024, the Ethics Commission had estimated vacant FTE position savings of \$30,948. The number of vacancies in the office has ranged from two to none with an average monthly vacancy rate of 0.57 FTE positions.

The status of the one-time funding is as follows:

- Professional fees Through March 2024, a total of \$55,620 of the professional fees funding has been spent.
- Office relocation costs The entire amount was spent. The Ethics Commission office is now located on the third floor of the judicial wing of the Capitol.
- One-time position startup costs The funding was utilized when the new position was filled in September 2023.
