

### **Continuing Appropriations**

University System capital building fund - North Dakota Century Code Section 15-54.1-01 - Appropriates funding from the University System capital building fund for campus extraordinary repairs, deferred maintenance, and certain legislatively authorized capital projects. The 2023 Legislative Assembly transferred \$24 million from the strategic investment and improvements fund to the University System capital building fund for the 2023-25 biennium, an increase of \$5 million from the \$19 million transferred from the strategic investment and improvements fund to the University System capital building fund for the 2021-23 biennium. The University System reports spending from this fund to the interim Higher Education Committee and the House and Senate Appropriations Committees.
