Selected Highlights

- Adds \$94,300 for salary increases of up to 4 percent effective July 1, 2025, and 3 percent effective July 1, 2026
- Adds \$54,048 for a health insurance increase of \$250 per month (15.2 percent), from \$1,643 to \$1,893, per employee
- Adds \$123,407, of which \$120,383 is from the general fund and \$3,024 is from federal funds, to replace the 2023-25 biennium new FTE pool (\$99,966) and 2023-25 biennium vacant FTE pool (\$23,441)
- Adds \$193,621 from federal funds for the highly rural transportation grant program
- Adds \$100,000 from the general fund for a commissioner salary equity increase
- Adds \$50,000 from the general fund for the posttraumatic stress disorder service dog program
- Adds one-time funding of \$291,500 from other funds for the Veterans' Home cemetery grant program

Deficiency Appropriations

The executive budget recommendation includes a deficiency appropriation of \$97,418 from the general fund for increased salary expenses.

Significant Audit Findings

There are no significant audit findings for this agency.

Agency Fees

SENATE BILL NO. 2025 (Governor's Recommendation)

Introduced by

(At the request of the Governor)

A bill for an act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of veterans' affairs and to provide an exemption.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the department of veterans' affairs for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the department of veterans' affairs, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027, as follows:

SECTION 3. EXEMPTION - POSTTRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER SERVICE DOG PROGRAM. The \$50,000 appropriated from the general fund for the posttraumatic stress disorder service dogs program in section 1 of chapter 53 of the 2021 Sessions Laws, is not subject to section 54-44.1-11, and any unspent funds from this program are available for the program during the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027.

any other provisions of law, the department of veterans' affairs may increase or decrease authorized full-time equivalent positions as needed, subject to availability of funds, during the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027. The department of veterans' affairs shall report to the office of management and budget and legislative council any adjustments made pursuant to this section.
