#### Selected Highlights

- Salary increases of up to 3 percent effective July 1, 2025, and 3 percent effective July 1, 2026
- Health insurance increase of \$250 per month (15.23 percent), from \$1,643 to \$1,893, per employee
- Adds funding to replace the 2023-25 vacant FTE pool (\$465,165) and the 2023-25 new FTE pool (\$986,476)
- Adds 2 FTE positions, including \$184,796 for 1 FTE loan specialist position and \$257,410 for 1 FTE accountant position
- Decreases funding for operating expenses (\$1,478,160) and grants (\$200,000) from budgetary savings
- Removes \$2.5 million of ongoing funding from the general fund for homeless grants

#### **Deficiency Appropriations**

### Significant Audit Findings

There are no significant audit findings for this agency.

#### Agency Fees

As reported to the Legislative Management, pursuant to North Dakota Century Code Section 54-35-27, this agency has 32 fees. The agency did not recommend any changes to the fees.

#### **Major Related Legislation**

**Senate Bill No. 2030 - Housing incentive fund and homelessness study** - Transfers \$200 million from the general fund to the housing incentive fund to address housing needs, transfers \$10 million from the general fund to the housing incentive fund for homeless grants, and appropriates \$50,000 from the general fund to the Housing Finance Agency for a study of homelessness in the state.
