National Guard emergency fund - North Dakota Century Code Section 37-01-04.1 - This fund allows the National Guard to respond to state emergencies. For the 2021-23 biennium, the fund had no revenue, no expenditures, and a fund balance of \$0 on June 30, 2023.

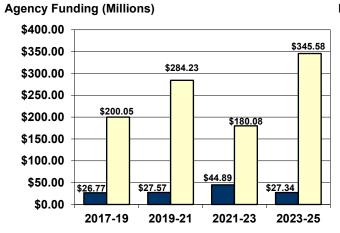
National Guard military grounds fund - Section 37-03-13 - This fund is used for collecting rental revenues to be used for purchasing military training grounds. For the 2021-23 biennium, the fund had \$355,176 of revenue, \$424,392 of expenditures, and a fund balance of \$1,860,299 on June 30, 2023.

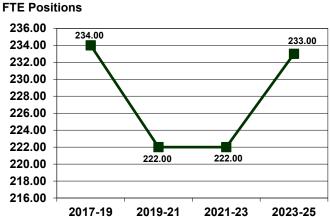
Veterans' Cemetery maintenance fund - Section 37-03-14 - This fund is used to support the operations of the Veterans' Cemetery. The fund receives \$5 from the issuance of each veteran's license plate, grave opening and closing fees, and private and federal funds for the operation of the Veterans' Cemetery. For the 2021-23 biennium, the fund had \$916,679 of revenue, \$1,362,874 of expenditures, and a fund balance of \$1,004,664 on June 30, 2023.

Veterans' Cemetery trust fund - Section 39-04-10.10 - This fund receives \$5 from the issuance of each veteran's license plate and donations. The interest in the fund is to be deposited in the Veterans' Cemetery maintenance fund for the purpose of providing funding for salaries and maintenance at the cemetery. For the 2021-23 biennium, the fund had \$206,004 of revenue and a fund balance of \$673,682 on June 30, 2023.
