**State Historical Society gifts and bequests fund** - North Dakota Century Code Section 55-01-04 - Gifts and bequests for support of museum operations. For the 2021-23 biennium, the fund had \$779,218 of revenue, \$305,629 of expenditures, and a fund balance of \$1,404,122 on June 30, 2023.

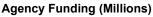
America 250 Commission - Section 55-01-14 - Provides the America 250 Commission may accept gifts, grants, and donations from public and nonpublic sources and may expend these funds for the purpose of coordinating and engaging in semiquincentennial activities in the state. Funding is deposited in the State Historical Society gifts and bequests fund. For the 2021-23 biennium, \$10,000 of revenue was received and deposited in the fund, \$0 was expended, and the balance was \$10,000 on June 30, 2023.

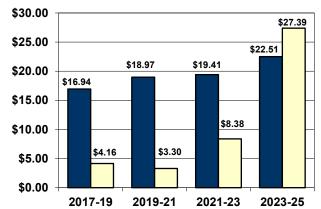
**Concession fund** - Section 55-02-04 - Operation of the State Historical Society museum store. For the 2021-23 biennium, the fund had \$2,064,372 of revenue, \$1,618,197 of expenditures, and a fund balance of \$1,999,493 on June 30, 2023.

**State Historical Society revolving fund** - Section 55-03-04 - For archaeological permits and the management and analysis of records and artifacts. For the 2021-23 biennium, the fund had \$39,050 of revenue, \$5,534 of expenditures, and a fund balance of \$151,341 on June 30, 2023.

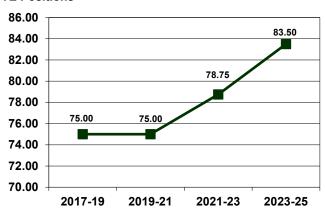
