Selected Highlights

- Adds \$1,588,535, of which \$601,106 is from the federal funds and \$987,429 is from special funds, for salary increases of up to 3 percent effective July 1, 2025, and 3 percent effective July 1, 2026
- Adds \$1,002,881, of which \$396,260 is from the federal funds and \$606,621 is from special funds, for a
 health insurance premium increase of \$250 per month (15.2 percent), from \$1,643 to \$1,893, per employee
- Adds \$3,420,755, of which \$1,489,600 is from federal funds and \$1,931,155 is from special funds, to replace the 2023-25 biennium new FTE pool (\$1,179,021) and 2023-25 biennium vacant FTE pool (\$2,241,734)
- Reduces ongoing funding of \$3,001,997, of which \$2,857,938 is from federal funds and \$150,059 is from the Game and Fish Department operating fund, for game and fish grants, including a reduction of \$1,650,000 for shooting ranges grants, resulting in \$1,650,000 remaining for shooting ranges grants
- Adds \$380,000 of one-time funding from the Game and Fish Department operating fund for information technology projects
- Adds \$150,000 of one-time funding from the Game and Fish Department operating fund to repair the Baukol-Noonan dam
- Adds \$160,200 of one-time funding, of which \$80,450 is from federal funds and \$79,750 is from the Game and Fish Department operating fund, for equipment
- Adds \$1,500,000 of one-time funding, of which \$1,125,000 is from federal funds and \$375,000 is from the Game and Fish Department operating fund, for pondliners at the Garrison Dam National Fish Hatchery
- Adds \$300,000 of one-time funding, of which \$225,000 is from federal funds and \$75,000 is from the Game and Fish Department operating fund, for high-pressure pumps at the Garrison Dam National Fish Hatchery
- Adds \$5,000,000 of one-time funding, of which \$4,100,000 is from federal funds and \$900,000 is from the habitat and depredation fund, for land habitat and deer depredation programs, including the habitat improvement program (\$1,000,000), private land open to sportsmen (PLOTS) payments (\$2,300,000), and the rangeland legacy program (\$1,700,000)

Deficiency Appropriations

There are no deficiency appropriations recommended in the executive budget for this agency.

Significant Audit Findings

The operational audit of the Game and Fish Department conducted by the State Auditor's office for the period ending June 30, 2022, did not identify any significant audit findings.

Agency Fees

As reported to the Legislative Management, pursuant to North Dakota Century Code Section 54-35-27, this agency has 227 fees. The agency did not recommend any changes to the fees but stated the agency is reviewing all license fees for recommended adjustments and removal of obsolete licenses.

Major Related Legislation

House Bill No. 1462 - This bill removes the requirement for a nonresident landowner to purchase a small game license, nonresident fishing license, and trapping license from the Game and Fish Department.

House Bill No. 1470 - This bill increases hunting and fishing fees.

Senate Bill No. 2216 - This bill requires a \$10 waterfowl habitat restoration stamp to be purchased in addition to the purchase of a resident small game license.
