CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO.

1 A concurrent resolution condemning the Netherlands' July 2026 sanctions decree targeting
2 Jewish communities in Israeli-controlled territories and urging federal review of trade barriers,
3 boycott requests, and burdens on United States commerce.

4 **WHEREAS**, North Dakota stands for truth, religious liberty, equal protection under law, and
5 opposes national origin-based discrimination; and

6 **WHEREAS**, Israel is a key ally and trading partner of the United States and North Dakota
7 has a compelling state interest in maintaining access to Israeli innovations and markets; and

8 **WHEREAS**, on July 21, 2026, the Netherlands published a temporary sanctions decree,
9 effective September 22, 2026, restricting trade involving goods originating in Jewish
10 communities in Jerusalem, Judea and Samaria, and the Golan Heights; and

11 **WHEREAS**, the Legislative Assembly is concerned foreign measures directed at commerce
12 involving Israeli-controlled territories may burden United States commerce, complicate supply
13 chain compliance, and pressure United States persons to provide certifications or assurances
14 that merit federal review;

15 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF**
16 **NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:**

17 That the Legislative Assembly condemns foreign measures that use postal codes or other
18 geographic proxies to single out those communities for adverse commercial treatment and
19 impose discriminatory burdens on the basis of religion and national origin; and

20 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Legislative Assembly urges the United States Trade
21 Representative and the Secretary of Commerce to evaluate the effects of the Dutch decree and
22 comparable measures on United States commerce, including potential trade barriers,
23 compliance burdens, and delayed or restricted shipments; and

24 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Legislative Assembly urges the United States
25 Secretary of Commerce, through the Bureau of Industry and Security and the Office of

1 Antiboycott Compliance, to issue timely guidance regarding whether requests for nonsettlement
2 certifications, negative-origin declarations, or comparable assurances constitute reportable
3 boycott-related requests under Title 15, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 760 and urges the
4 Secretary of Treasury to include on the quarterly boycott-country list required under Title 26,
5 United States Code, Section 999 any country that requires participation in or cooperation with
6 an international boycott; and

7 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this resolution
8 to the President of the United States, the United States Secretary of State, the United States
9 Secretary of Commerce, the United States Trade Representative, the Secretary of Homeland
10 Security, the Secretary of Treasury, and each member of the North Dakota Congressional
11 Delegation.
