 Provide explanation:
 Yes, this program has been in our appropriation for the past three biennia and has increased in popularity with the school districts. These are special funds because the food processor bills us and the school districts reimburse us for their portion.

 Provide explanation:
 The legislature rightly expects agencies to look for cost savings for the tax-paying public continuously. This program allows the Department of Public Instruction to negotiate a single statewide food processing contract in which districts can participate.
 Because of this bulk discount, districts receive a lower cost than if they had negotiated a contract separately.

Provide an explanation as to how the request supports state priorities, improves state efficiencies, and promotes effective state government:

The request will promote state priorities in that the NDDPI Child Nutrition and Food Distribution office can continue to support schools in providing healthy meals to students through cost-effective methods. The additional spending authority will allow the state to continue to offer value-added USDA products to schools for their meal programs which will decrease costs for schools.

The request improves the program's efficiencies in that NDDPI will continue to purchase value-added USDA foods under contract with vendors, draw down on USDA bulk food pounds already purchased for FY 2023 and avoid supply chain issues by having these value-added USDA products available to schools.

The request will promote effective state government in that NDDPI will continue to support schools in their food service programs.
