Testimony House Bill 1073 House Judiciary Committee January 6, 2021, 11:00 am North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality

Good morning Chairman Klemin and members of the House Judiciary Committee. My name is David Glatt, Director of the North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ). The DEQ is responsible for the implementation and enforcement of many of the federal and state environmental protection programs in North Dakota. I provide this testimony in support of HB 1073.

To help ensure facility operational integrity and safe handling of specific hazardous materials, the DEQ can require individuals or responsible parties to complete a criminal history background check prior to gaining employment or receiving a permit or license to operate in the state. Some background checks may go beyond the state boundaries and require access to Federal Bureau of Investigation Criminal History Record Information (CHRI).

As part of the transition from the NDDOH to the DEQ, the US Department of Justice – FBI Office of the General Council reviewed NDCC 12-60-24 (2) as it relates to the requirement for state or federal background checks. It was determined the law as written did not qualify the state for access to the FBI CHRI pursuant to Pub. L 92-544. To allow access to the federal CHRI and provide clarity to the NDCC 12-60-24 (2) we are proposing the following:

Section 1 Amendment. Subdivision vv:

Line 15 Delete: ... or an employee specified in occupation ...

Line 16 add: ... a job opening or a current employee...

Line 18 and 19 Delete: ... registration, certification or licensure by the department

Line 19 and 20 add: ... a radioactive materials license under chapter 23.1-03 or a solid waste permit under chapter 23.1-08

Section 2 relates to activities conducted by the ND Department of Health.

Section 3 identifies that the Department has the authority to require a background check of an applicant for a license or permit under section 12-60-24. It goes on to state that if the applicant is not an individual, the state may require the individual responsible for the applicant to complete a background check and submit the information to the state at their cost.

These proposed changes to the statute have been provided to the DOJ for their review and concurrence.

House Bill 1073 Judiciary Committee January 6, 2021, 11 a.m.

Good morning Chairman Klemin and members of the Judiciary Committee. My name is Bridget Weidner and I serve as the Director of the Division of Health Facilities for the North Dakota Department of Health (NDDoH). I am here to provide testimony in support of the proposed amendment to HB 1073, which provides for the NDDoH to conduct Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI)/Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) criminal background checks for individuals on the nurse aide registry and emergency medical services (EMS) registry.

Under North Dakota Administrative Code § 33-43-01-22-(1)(b), the NDDoH is authorized to deny, suspend, revoke or encumber the registration status of an individual who has been "convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a nurse aide." As such, it is the department's responsibility to do our part to protect the vulnerable populations these nurse aides serve. In order to do this, the NDDoH needs access to an individual's criminal background. Currently, we only have access to the public court records and do not have access to the federal criminal records.

To provide an example, in October 2020, we had a situation with an individual applying for nurse aide registration. She had prior multiple drug felonies and felony charges related to theft of property, endangerment of child or vulnerable adult, and failure to appear after release. These charges were older; however, she was still on probation. Because this seemed unusual, staff from our registry contacted the probation officer and found that she had a recent federal felony for distribution of methamphetamine. She was incarcerated and then placed on probation. We were not able to obtain any additional information related to these federal charges since the registry does not have all of the information needed to ensure the protection of our vulnerable population. An applicant could have federal felonies that the nurse aide registry does not know about. Again, our responsibility is to ensure protection for our vulnerable population, including

23-27-04.3. Emergency medical services personnel training, testing, certification, licensure, and quality review – Penalty.

The state health council shall adopt rules prescribing minimum training, testing, certification, licensure, and quality review standards for emergency medical services personnel, instructors, and training institutions. Rules adopted must include a definition of minimum applicable standards, a definition of emergency medical services personnel, provide for a mechanism for certifying or licensing persons who have met the required standards, provide a mechanism to review and improve the quality of care rendered by emergency medical services personnel, and define minimum standards for emergency medical services training institutions. Licensing as an emergency medical services training institution is optional. The department may require an applicant for a certificate or license, or the holder of a certificate or license, issued pursuant to this section to submit to a statewide and nationwide criminal history record check. The nationwide criminal history record check must be conducted in the manner provided in section 12-60-24. All costs associated with the criminal history record check are the responsibility of the applicant or registrant. It is a class B misdemeanor for an individual to willfully misrepresent that individual's certification or licensing status as emergency medical services personnel. Quality review and improvement information, data, records, and proceedings are not subject to subpoena or discovery or introduction into evidence in any civil action.

The DEQ is responsible for the implementation and enforcement of many of the federal and state environmental protection programs in North Dakota. I provide this testimony in support of HB 1073.

To help ensure facility operational integrity and safe handling of specific hazardous materials, the DEQ can require individuals or responsible parties to complete a criminal history background check prior to gaining employment or receiving a permit or license to operate in the state. Some background checks may go beyond the state boundaries and require access to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Criminal History Record Information (CHRI).

As part of the transition from the NDDOH to the DEQ, the US Department of Justice – FBI Office of the General Council reviewed NDCC 12-60-24 (2) as it relates to the requirement for state or federal background checks. It was determined the law as written did not qualify the state for access to the FBI CHRI pursuant to Pub. L 92-544.

HB 1073 is intended to address concerns of the FBI in the following sections:

<u>Section 1</u>: Provides specificity as to the types of individuals or occupations that may require a criminal background check;

<u>Section 2</u>: Provides language that the DEQ may require individuals or an individual designated as responsible for an applicant to complete a criminal background check and identifies who is responsible for the costs to complete a background check.
