NDDOT supports efforts which promote and provide incentives to explore careers in transportation, particularly high-demand occupations requiring a commercial driver's license (CDL). Approximately 35% of our workforce currently requires a CDL.

Chair Heinert and members of the House Education Committee, my name is Lisa Johnson, and I serve as the Vice Chancellor of Academic and Student Affairs for the North Dakota University System. I am here today on behalf of the North Dakota University System and its eleven institutions and the four TrainND quadrants across the state to provide supporting testimony related to HB1032.

TrainND, operating from the campuses of Bismarck State College, Lake Region State College, Williston State College and the North Dakota State College of Science, provided customized training to 14,468 individuals in 1,729 businesses across the four quadrants of the state in 2022.

Two TrainND's top training programs are for individuals pursuing a commercial driver's license or certification to be a nursing assistant.

The TrainND directors from each of the four quadrants were asked for an estimate of the length of these two programs, the number of individuals enrolled in those two programs for the last two years, and the cost associated with each program.

TrainND – Enrolled Participants

7/1/2020 through 6/30/2022

A total of 556 individuals completed CNA training and 373 individuals completed CDL training during the two-year period of 2020-2022 through TrainND. Note the length of training for CDL programs is almost twice as long to complete and the cost to participants in a CDL programs is significantly more than that of the CNA program.

With the proposed appropriation of \$1 million associated with HB1032 in mind, one suggestion from the TrainND directors was to increase the CDL scholarship from \$500 to \$1,500 per individual. As currently proposed, the \$500 scholarship covers about half of the CNA training but only about 8% of the CDL training.

This concludes my testimony related to HB1032. I respectfully request a "Do Pass" with the consideration of an amendment to increase the scholarship amount associated with the CDL programs in the amount of \$1,500. I stand for questions from Committee members.

Chairman Heinert and members of the Committee, my name is Andrea Pfennig, and I'm here today on behalf of the the North Dakota Motor Carriers Association (NDMCA), in support of HB 1032.

According to the NDSU Challey Institute for Global Innovation and Growth, Transportation and Warehousing accounts for 4.7% of the state's GDP. Reliable transportation networks expand markets by allowing North Dakota businesses to sell products across the state, to other states, and internationally. North Dakota has the nation's most freight-dependent economy.

Like other industries in the state, workforce is poses a significant challenge. Our members support the creation and expansion of programs that recognize truck drivers and diesel mechanics as high demand occupations and offer financial assistance, such as scholarships and low interest loans, towards the pursuit of education in these fields. It important to note that CDL training does not qualify for traditional financial aid, so solidifying other options are important to assist in meeting this skilled workforce need.

NDMCA thanks the Committee for your consideration and urges a **do pass** recommendation.
