<sup>3</sup>Joint Rule 203(1) provides a bill, other than a delayed bill, may not be sent to the second house for concurrence after the 37<sup>th</sup> legislative day. In 2025, the House and Senate made crossover on the 34<sup>th</sup> legislative day, Tuesday, February 25.

<sup>4</sup>Section 7 of Article IV of the Constitution of North Dakota limits regular sessions to 80 natural days during a biennium and defines a "natural day" as a period of 24 consecutive hours. House and Senate Rules 104 provide that a legislative day begins at 7:00 a.m., so each legislative day ends at 7:00 a.m. the following day.
