# **TESTIMONY**

Doug Nelson, State Fire Marshal House Industry, Business and Labor Committee January 8, 2025

Good Morning Chairman Warrey and members of the House Industry, Business and Labor Committee. For the record, my name is Doug Nelson, State Fire Marshal. I stand before you today in support of House Bill 1086, which is an agency bill created to address the use of the reduced cigarette ignition propensity and firefighter protection act enforcement fund and hopefully not over complicate a very simple bill.

To provide some background, this fund was established in 2009 through HB 1368 under the Attorney General's Office, where the Fire Marshal Division was housed until last session. The purpose of the fund is to support the Fire Marshal in ensuring that cigarette brands are tested to meet specific performance standards designed to reduce fire hazards and prevent loss of life and property. Cigarette manufacturers must comply with these standards and contribute to the fund every three years.

HB 1086 expands the allowable uses of the fund to include Fire Marshal-related expenditures beyond the currently specified activities. Currently, the fund is primarily used for purchasing testing supplies, such as cigarettes and hairspray (totaling approximately \$11 for the biennium), as well as covering the salary and benefits of the Administrative Assistant when processing certifications (totaling approximately \$10,117 for the biennium). In comparison, the fund has received \$71,250 in fees during this biennium, with a current cash balance of \$464,303.

The State Fire Marshal's Office exists to protect public safety by enforcing laws that prevent fires, ensure safe handling of dangerous materials, maintain fire safety infrastructure, investigate fires, and educate the public about fire risks and prevention. Their role is essential in promoting fire safety and reducing the loss of life and property due to fires. We believe this proposed language change will provide greater flexibility in utilizing the funds, eliminating the need for overly specific restrictions. The Fire Marshal's Office will continue to fulfill the original purpose of the fund, ensuring its intended objectives are met while allowing for more efficient use of resources.

Chairman Warrey and members of the committee, I respectfully request a Do Pass recommendation, and am happy to answer any questions that you may have.

To Representative Warrey, Chairman House Industry, Business and Labor Committee, and Committee members,

This additional information is being provided in an effort to answer questions brought by the committee during the hearing on HB 1086 on January 8<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

Representative Kasper requested detailed budget numbers. As of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024, the State Fire Marshal's Office has spent a total of \$10,128.79 from Fund 374 (the Reduced Cigarette Ignition Propensity fund). These funds were spent in ways and resources to carry-out the responsibilities or directly related to the responsibilities of this fund as prescribed in code.

The trial balance report for the fund is as follows for the biennium up to December 31st, 2024:

Representative Schauer requested further explanation and detail of public safety initiatives the proceeds of this fund could be used for outside of the Ignition Propensity for Cigarettes program. Our focus for

having further authority to spend these funds would be to support public safety equipment, public safety education, and fire prevention training for fire chiefs.

Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Alarm Distribution program. This program would be designed to assist in getting smoke and carbon monoxide (co) alarms distributed and installed for high-risk populations and homes that can't or struggle to afford their own fire safety equipment. This would include funding available to purchase or install smoke and CO alarms for special or other needs populations such as bed shakers, voice alarms, and strobe notification alarms. The program would also identify schools, childcares and state buildings where carbon monoxide alarms may not be installed due to changes in fire codes, and enable assistance to distribute and install carbon monoxide alarms in these occupancies.

- Biennium Budget estimate:
  - Equipment (smoke/CO alarms, special needs alarms) \$10,000.00

**Firesafe Cannula Kits (oxygen tubing thermal cut-offs) Program.** These kits can help prevent further injury and fire from smoking while on medical oxygen fires. The State of North Dakota has had multiple fatal fires resulting from smoking while on oxygen over the last few years. Oxygen tubing thermal cut-offs can help prevent further damage and injury if a cigarette ignites oxygen and tubing. Our goal through this program would be to work with the Department of Health and Human Services to identify high-risk populations and make this equipment available.

- Biennium Budget estimate:
  - Equipment (thermal cutoffs, tubing connections) \$5,000.00

**Public Education Fire Safety Videos and Campaigns.** This program would aim to utilize our current website and social media, but to build upon it with fire safety educational messages geared to various high-risk populations. This would include, but not be limited to, childcare fire safety videos, school age fire safety program, college age fire safety program, and others as identified or needed.

- Biennium Budget estimate:
  - Equipment/services (video equipment, production services) \$10,000.00

**Fire Prevention Instructional Videos for Fire Chiefs.** This program would provide online video training for various types of inspections that fire chiefs are expected to complete, and basic fire investigation procedures. The State Fire Marshals Office receives requests regularly from volunteer fire chiefs to provide further training or have training resources available for the noted topics. This would help expand fire safety inspection and investigation procedures throughout the state, resulting in more effective, efficient and consistent fire prevention.

- Biennium Budget estimate:
  - Equipment/services (video equipment, production services) \$10,000.00

There are other programs and initiatives that could help public fire safety and services to fire departments in North Dakota, but the above summarized plans are where our office is most prepared to make a difference. I hope this helps answer the questions from testimony. Please let me know if the committee has any further questions I can help with at this time.

There is established in the state treasury a special fund to be known as the Reduced Cigarette Ignition Propensity and Firefighter Protection Actreduced cigarette ignition propensity and firefighter protection act enforcement fund. The fund must consist of all certification fees submitted by manufacturers, and, in addition to any other moneys made available, be available pursuant to legislative appropriation, to defray the expenses associated with the administration of the state fire marshal solely to support processing, testing, enforcement, and oversight activities under this chapterdepartment.

**SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 18-13-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

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Cigarette Ignition Propensity and Firefighter Protection Act enforcement fund. The fund

must consist of all certification fees submitted by manufacturers, and, in addition to


any other moneys made available, be available pursuant to legislative appropriation, to the state fire marshal solely to support processing, testing, enforcement, and oversight activities under this chapter.

the cigarette which is likely to alter its compliance with the reduced cigarette ignition propensity standards required by this chapter, that cigarette may not be sold or offered for sale in this state until the manufacturer retests the cigarette in accordance with the testing standards set forth in section 18-13-02 and maintains records of that retesting as required by section 18-13-02. Any altered cigarette that does not meet the performance standards set forth in section 18-13-02 may not be sold in this state.

**SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 26.1-01-07.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

# 26.1-01-07.1. Insurance regulatory trust fund established.

- 1. There is hereby created a trust fund designated "insurance regulatory trust fund". The following amounts must be deposited in the insurance regulatory trust fund:
  - a. All sums received under section 18-13-03.
  - b. All sums received under section 26.1-01-07.
  - b.c. All sums received under section 26.1-01-07.2 from the insurance regulatory trust fund investments.
  - e.d. All retaliatory fees imposed upon persons by the insurance department as authorized by law.
  - d.e. All administrative penalties, fines, and fees collected by the commissioner from any person subject to this title.
  - e.f. Any other amounts provided by legislative appropriation.
- 2. The moneys so received and deposited in the insurance regulatory trust fund are reserved for use by the insurance department to defray the expenses of the department in the discharge of its administrative and regulatory powers and duties as prescribed by law subject to the applicable laws relating to the appropriations of state funds and to the deposit and expenditure of state moneys. The insurance department is responsible for the proper expenditure of these moneys as provided by law.





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- 3. Except as otherwise provided by law, after the fiscal year has been closed and all expenses relating to the fiscal year have been accounted for, the office of management and budget shall transfer any fund balance remaining in the insurance regulatory trust fund that exceeds one million dollars to the general fund.
- SECTION 3. REPEAL. Section 18-13-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.

#### **TESTIMONY SUPPORTING HB 1086**

John Arnold, Deputy Insurance Commissioner Senate Industry and Business Committee March 17, 2025

Good morning, Chairman Barta and members of the committee. I stand before you today to introduce and ask for your support of HB 1086.

HB 1086 is an agency bill created to address the use of the Reduced Cigarette Ignition Propensity and Firefighter Protection Act enforcement fund. The fund was established in 2009 through HB 1368 during the 61<sup>st</sup> Legislative Assembly under the Attorney General's Office, where the State Fire Marshal's Office was housed. The purpose of the fund is to support the Fire Marshal in ensuring that cigarette brands are tested to meet specific performance standards designed to reduce the likelihood of a cigarette to cause a fire. This reduces fire hazards, prevents loss of life and property, and is in line with similar programs that are in place in most every other state.

To be in compliance with the program, cigarette manufacturers must initially test, then retest each brand to be sold in the state every three years. Along with the application packet documenting the testing and results, the companies must submit a \$250.00 fee for each cigarette brand. The State Fire Marshal's Office is required to report the findings and results of this program to the Interim Health Committee every interim session. The fees collected are currently deposited into a separate fund that is used for purchasing testing supplies, equipment to aid in carrying out the program, and the salary and benefits of the Administrative Assistant when processing these application certifications. Currently, we have spent approximately \$11,072 for the biennium. The fund has received \$102,500 in fees this biennium, and the fund has a current balance of approximately \$494,611.

The State Fire Marshal's Office exists to protect public safety by enforcing laws that prevent fires, ensure safe handling of dangerous materials, maintain fire safety infrastructure, investigate fires, and educate the public about fire risks and prevention. The Fire Marshal's role is essential in promoting fire safety and reducing risk and loss of life and property due to fires. We believe this proposed language change will provide greater flexibility in utilizing the funds by eliminating the need for overly specific restrictions. The State Fire Marshal's Office will continue to fulfill the original purpose of the fund, ensuring its intended objectives are met while allowing for more efficient use of resources.

Chairman Barta, members of the committee, I respectfully request your support with a do pass recommendation on HB 1086. Thank you for your time and I am happy to answer any questions.
