I am writing to express my strong support for House Bill 1192, which addresses the limitation on the value of a primary prize (and total of prizes) a permitted organization conducting a raffle may award. This legislation is an important step toward supporting charitable organizations, fostering community engagement, and updating gaming laws to reflect current needs and opportunities.

Our Club manages one major fundraiser per year, supporting both the local Rural Fire District and the Community Club in Minnewaukan. By raising or removing restrictive prize value limitations, this bill will enable our organization to offer more substantial prize incentives, increasing participation in this community event, as well as many like ours around the state. This, in turn, will help generate more funds for the vital programs and services we provide to citizens in and around Minnewaukan.
