- 7 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-04-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

- 9 **43-04-01. Definitions.**
- In this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:
- "Board" means the board of barber examiners.
- 12 2. "Mobile barbershop" means a barbershop operated in a mobile vehicle, trailer, or
- mobile structure for the exclusive use of practicing barbering services performed by a
- 14 licensed barber.
- 15 3. "Practice of barbering" includes any one or any combination of the following practices
- when done upon the upper part of the human body for cosmetic purposes and not for
- 17 the treatment of diseases or physical or mental ailments, and when done for payment
- 18 either directly or indirectly:
- a. Shaving or trimming the beard or cutting the hair.



1 Giving facial or scalp massages or treatments with oils, creams, lotions, or other 2 preparations either by hand or mechanical appliances. 3 Singeing, shampooing, or dyeing the hair or applying hair tonics. 4 Applying cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, powders, oils, clays, or lotions to d. 5 scalp, face, neck, or upper part of the body. 6 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-04-42 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows: 8 43-04-42. Fees. 9 The board may charge applicants the following fees: 10 For examination and issuance of a certificate to practice master barbering, one a. 11 hundred dollars. 12 b. For renewal of a master barber's certificate, one hundred dollars. 13 For restoration of an expired master barber's certificate, a twenty dollar penalty C. 14 fee in addition to the regular renewal fee. 15 d. For a permit to operate a barber school or college, an annual fee of one hundred 16 twenty-five dollars. 17 For issuance of an annual barbershop license, fifty dollars, to be paid by each e. 18 shop owner in advance. 19 For issuance of a certificate to an applicant who qualifies under section f. 20 43-04-38.1, one hundred seventy-five dollars. 21 For restoration of an expired barbershop license, a twenty dollar penalty fee in 22 addition to the annual license fee. 23 For renewal of an instructor's license, twenty-five dollars. 24 Each application to open or establish a barbershop in this state must be accompanied 2. 25 by a fee of one hundred dollars to cover expenses of inspection, which must be 26 retained by the board and deposited as other fees. 27 A duplicate license, certificate, or permit must be issued upon: 28 Filing a statement verified by the oath of the applicant which explains the loss; a. 29 Submitting a signed photograph of the applicant; and b. 30 C. Paying a fee of ten dollars for the issuance of the duplicate.



Anyone who becomes a member of the armed forces of the United States in time of 1 war, while holding a license as a barber or apprentice, and while in good standing as 2 to payment of fees, may obtain a certificate restoration without payment of the 3 4 restoration fee. Each application to open or establish a mobile barbershop must be accompanied by a 5 5. fee of one hundred fifty dollars for initial registration. Renewal of a mobile barbershop 6 certificate must be accompanied by a fee of one hundred dollars. 7 SECTION 3. A new section to chapter 43-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 8 9 and enacted as follows: 10 Mobile barbershop - Regulations - Requirements. An individual may operate a mobile barbershop if: 11 The individual is a licensed barber under section 43-04-32; and 12 a. The mobile barbershop is registered with the board. 13 b. The board shall adopt rules regulating mobile barbershops. The rules adopted by the 14 2. board must regulate water, wastewater, power, safety, sanitation, equipment, services, 15 location, reports, and any other requirements deemed necessary.
