HB 1356 Testimony

Good afternoon, chairman Schauer and members of the Government and Veterans affairs committee, my name is Mike Lefor, and I serve District 37 - Dickinson in the House of Representatives. I am here to speak in support of HB 1356. This legislation would give the leaders of each of the four caucuses in the North Dakota legislative assembly to view bill drafts requested by legislative members in their caucus.

This is becoming more important due to the large number of bills being brought forward this session. A leader could look at the totality of the list and reach out to individual legislators to let them know of others who might be working on similar legislation to eliminate duplicative efforts.

Additionally, if there are legislators interested in a certain topic or topics this would give the leader the ability to ask them to work together to put the potential legislation in the best form it can be.

When small groups of legislators work together much as was done in the case of the animal agriculture bill last session, work was done with many agricultural groups to support loosening the ownership laws surrounding animal agriculture. As a result of this legislation, there are two dairy cattle businesses relocating to North Dakota with total herds of 40,000.

This was done on a proactive basis without bill drafts, however, this is an example of the possibility of other groups working together to provide great legislation on a variety of topics.

Finally, I believe this has the potential to promote better teamwork by getting likeminded individuals working together. This is an example of how the legislative branch can go from being reactive in this area to proactive and I think it would provide many exciting opportunities. With that, I ask the committee to consider a "do pass" recommendation on HB 1356. Thank you.

#### 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 44-04-18.6 of the North Dakota Century Code is 8 amended and reenacted as follows: 9 44-04-18.6. Access to legislative records and information. 10 The following records, regardless of form or characteristic, of or relating to the 11 legislative-council, the legislative-management, the legislative-assembly, the house of-12 representatives, the senate, or a member of the legislative assembly are not subject to-13 section 44-04-18 and section 6 of article XI of the Constitution of North Dakota: 14 A record of a purely personal or private nature; 15 b. A record that is legislative council work product or is legislative council client-16 communication: 17 A record that reveals the content of communications between a member of the 18 legislative assembly and any person; and

- d. Except with respect to a governmental entity determining the proper use of telephone service, a record of telephone usage which identifies the parties or lists the telephone numbers of the parties involved.
- 2. The exception in subdivision c of subsection 1 applies to records possessed by a member of the legislative assembly or by any other public officer or employee.
- 3. This section does not apply to any record distributed at a meeting subject to section-44-04-19 and section 5 of article XI of the Constitution of North Dakota.
- 4. Notwithstanding subsection 1, information related to a request to the legislative council-made by a member of the legislative assembly for a draft of a bill or resolution or a revision to a bill or resolution may be disclosed to the caucus leader of the requester's political faction.

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 54-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

## Requests for legislation - Legislative council - Disclosure to caucus leader.

- The legislative council shall disclose to the caucus leader of the requester's political
   faction the topic of a request to the legislative council made by a member of the

A draft or revision of a draft bill or resolution drafted for a member of the legislative assembly may be disclosed to the caucus leader of the requester's political faction, unless the member of the legislative assembly elects to maintain the confidentiality of the draft or revision of a draft bill or resolution with respect to the caucus leader of the requester's political faction in the manner prescribed by the legislative council.

**SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 54-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

# Requests for legislation - Legislative council - Disclosure to caucus leader.

- 1. The legislative council shall disclose to the caucus leader of the requester's political faction the topic of a request to the legislative council made by a member of the legislative assembly for a draft bill or resolution or a revision to a draft bill or resolution and the name of the requester.

- 3. Records disclosed to the caucus leader of the requester's political faction under this section are not subject to section 44-04-18 and section 6 of article XI of the Constitution of North Dakota.
