

#### **Chairperson Heinert, Members of the House Education Committee,**

My name is Matt Liebel, and I am here today to express my strong support for House Bill 1547, which seeks to create a committee to study special education funding during the 2025-26 interim.

I spent 15 years as a middle school science teacher and recently transitioned into my role as a Field Consultant for North Dakota United. As part of this work, I am involved in the NDU SPED Collective, where I hear directly from special education teachers about the challenges they face. One of the most pressing concerns they share is the inadequacy and complexity of special education funding.

Special education teachers are working with increasing caseloads, limited resources, and a lack of adequate support staff. Schools are struggling to meet the needs of students due to funding shortfalls, forcing difficult decisions that impact services, staffing, and the overall quality of education for students with disabilities. Without a thorough examination of how special education is funded in North Dakota, these challenges will only continue to grow.

A dedicated study of special education funding is a necessary step in identifying solutions that ensure equitable and sustainable support for students, teachers, and schools. HB 1547 provides an opportunity for stakeholders to collaborate, analyze funding gaps, and recommend policies that will strengthen special education across the state.

I urge this committee to support HB 1547 and take action to ensure that North Dakota's special education system is adequately funded and prepared to meet the needs of all students. Thank you for your time and consideration.

# HB 1547 Senate Education Tuesday, March 12, 2025 Senator Todd Beard, Chair

Chairman Beard and Members of the Senate Education Committee:

My name is Roxane Romanick and I'm here today as a representative for Designer Genes of ND, Inc., Designer Genes represents individuals with Down syndrome and their families across the state. Designer Genes' mission is to strengthen opportunities for individuals with Down syndrome and those who support them to earn, learn, and belong. I am also the parent to an adult daughter with Down syndrome, who is competitively employed due to her access to general education curriculum and special education supports.

We project, that outside of North Dakota students with Down syndrome being homeschooled, all other children, youth, and young adults with Down syndrome are covered by the guarantees of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and are served under Individual Education Plans and afforded special education services. The provisions of a free and appropriate education (FAPE) and learning in a least restrictive environment (LRE) with specially designed approaches to learning and targeted adaptations mean that our students have learning opportunities available to them that older individuals with Down syndrome went without. As an organization, we are concerned about the academic achievements of our children, youth, and young adults with Down syndrome in North Dakota because we know that high expectations, highly qualified professionals, and quality instructional strategies are critical to learning. We most certainly know all of the above requires adequate funding and funding methodology.

Designer Genes is in support of HR 1547, but I am asking the committee to consider an addition to the language of an amendment that would include a representative from a statewide family support organization that supports family members of children who receive special education. I'm asking for the consideration of this added language, because there is no parent representation on the committee and the study language discusses the use of Medicaid funds for reimbursement. Under the Individuals with

Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), parents have to provide permission for any medical insurance, including Medicaid, to be used to school-based services. Since there will be discussion in this study that will impact parent and student rights, I ask for strong consideration of this added language.
