



BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated from special funds derived from income to the office of administrative hearings for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the office of administrative hearings, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027, as follows:

The mission of the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) is to conduct orderly, fair, and impartial hearings and to issue prompt, reasoned recommended or final decisions. If a person receives a benefit or license from the state, the person is entitled to a hearing under the Due Process Clause of the Constitution. OAH provides substantive due process by deciding justly with well-reasoned decisions in accordance with the law. OAH also provides procedural due process by providing a neutral and unbiased tribunal that is independent from the governmental entity that provides the benefit or license. OAH listens to both sides of a dispute and allows each party the right to present evidence and cross-examine the other party's evidence. If the governmental entity that provides the benefit or license were to

make the determination, there is the perception of bias. OAH provides experienced, professional, and neutral judges.

STAFF:

The prior director, Tim Dawson, retired on January 3, 2025. OAH currently has two full-time administrative law judges (ALJs) - Jessica Binder, who started with our office in July 2021; and myself, who started in November 2018. OAH has two additional FTEs – our office manager Frances Zuther and administrative assistant Louise Wetzel. OAH also contracts with four part-time, as-needed ALJs. The contracted ALJs primarily handle Workforce Safety and Insurance (WSI) hearings. Three of these ALJs work, or are located, in Fargo, and one is in Bismarck.

The full-time, permanent ALJs conduct a mixture of different agency hearings but, primarily, Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Public Service Commission (PSC), Workforce Safety and Insurance (WSI), Human Resource Management Services - state employee grievance hearings, and occupational licensing hearings. For 2024, I, Judge Hogan, had primarily a full workload of WSI hearings. The other two full-time ALJs conducted mainly DHHS hearings and other agency hearings. OAH will go forward into the 2025-2027 biennium with the same structure. Workload considerations and the need for the replacement of contract ALJs may require new contract ALJs at some time in the future as caseloads increase. Another option to handle additional caseload would be for OAH to employ more full-time, permanent ALJs. Currently, OAH does not have that authority.

CASELOAD:

OAH conducts hearings for:

- State and local agencies and entities that are required to use OAH (see N.D.C.C.
 §§ 54-57-03(1), 40-51.2-12, 40-47-01.1, and 15.1-15-08);
- State agencies that voluntarily use OAH, such as the PSC, the Insurance Department, the Industrial Commission, the Department of Water Resources, colleges and universities for personnel hearings, UND Title IX hearings, and occasionally Job Service North Dakota for conflict unemployment compensation hearings; and
- Local entities such as cities or counties that voluntarily use OAH to conduct such hearings as employee discipline.

Over the years, OAH has conducted hearings for over 100 different state and local government agencies or entities. Some agencies make many requests for hearing each year, while others have made only a few requests for hearing since OAH was established. The table below shows the number of requests by year:

For calendar year 2023, 27 different agencies or entities made 446 requests for hearing. For calendar year 2024, 22 different agencies or entities made 499 requests for hearing. Combined, OAH had 945 requested hearings from 34 different agencies or entities. *See* Attachment "A." This is an increase from the prior two years (2021 and 2022) where OAH had 768 requested hearings from 39 different agencies or entities.

For the first 18 months of this biennium (July 1, 2023, through December 31, 2024), 26 different agencies or entities have made 720 requests for hearing. *See* Attachment "B." As you can see from the attachments, the bulk of requests for hearing have come from two agencies, DHHS and WSI, which is typical for most biennia. Another increasingly frequent OAH user in the last few years is the PSC. OAH has also started conducting Title IX hearings for the University of North Dakota.

OAH does not hold a hearing for every request made. Some cases settle prior to hearing; some requests are withdrawn or abandoned; and on occasion, matters are disposed of by prehearing motion. Attachment "C" shows the number of hearings held for calendar years 2023 and 2024. Approximately 65 percent of hearing requests went to hearing. In the previous two years (2021 and 2022), 66 percent of the hearing requests went to hearing. Historically, between 45 percent and 55 percent of hearing requests go to hearing.

While not for all cases, OAH routinely holds prehearing conferences. This is an opportunity to confer with the parties prior to the hearing; answer questions or address concerns; and pick a hearing date, location, and prehearing deadlines. Prehearing conferences are usually held for the more complex cases. Attachment "D" shows 341 prehearing conferences held for calendar years 2023 and 2024, down slightly from 387 for

calendar years 2021 and 2022. As a percentage of hearings requested, the percentage of prehearing conferences is downward somewhat at about 36 percent.

As our caseload evolves, another way to gauge our activity is to look at billable hours:

See Attachment "E." As you can see, our billable hours for DHHS have remained steady and have rebounded since COVID, but our billable hours attributed to WSI cases are significantly down.

BUDGET:

- The OAH budget is funded completely through special funds and with no federal funds.
- OAH has a continuing appropriation under North Dakota Century Code Section 54-57-07.
- The OAH budget has little to no change from last biennium.
- The OAH budget is two lines; one for salaries and benefits for the 5 FTEs and one for operating. Of the operating line, 78 percent is to pay contract ALJs for work completed, 7 percent for IT, and 5.7 percent for office space.
- OAH charges an hourly fee for its service to the entities requesting hearings. The rate of \$215 per hour has been in place since July 1, 2023. As of January 2025, the rate

was increased to \$265 to account for decreased billable hours. OAH contracts with WSI, so the rate for WSI will not increase until the start of the next biennium.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS AND CHALLENGES

• **WSI Case Processing.** Under N.D.C.C. § 54-57-09, OAH is required to track processing time of WSI cases. The goal is to average 215 days or less from the date the case is received by OAH to the date the decision issued. OAH must track this on a monthly, rolling six-month average. OAH has adopted case processing standards to meet this goal. OAH reports to the state advisory council each quarter.


Attachment "F" shows the rolling average for the current biennium. OAH has reduced the average number of days to process a case from 290 to around 150 days. This is a reduction of at least 135 days or about 53 percent and is below the goal of under 215 days.

• **Conducting Hearings.** With CARES Act money, OAH equipped its hearing rooms with equipment to conduct video conferences for hearings and improved audio recording equipment to help facilitate these hearings. OAH conducts remote hearings when requested using this technology.

OAH also conducts in-person hearings both in OAH hearing rooms and in remote locations across the state. In-person hearings are common for WSI hearings and cases concerning professional licensure matters and parental rights. Sometimes a hearing involves credibility issues. It is advantageous to judge demeanor and credibility when hearing testimony face-to-face. In addition to credibility issues, OAH continues to conduct in-person hearings for complex cases or when requested by the parties. Being able to talk

directly to the ALJ reflects well on the accessibility of government, and this value exceeds the increased cost and inconvenience to the ALJ and agency involved.

- OAH continues to explore other ways to incorporate technology and make our office more accessible. One priority is to adopt procedures for submitting documents electronically.
- Funding. Our biggest current challenge is funding. While our hearing requests increased this past year by 53, our billable time has decreased by 327.5 hours. There are many reasons for the decrease in billable hours, such as an increase in the number of cases that settle, many DHHS cases do not generate many billable hours per case, more hearings being held by video conference versus traveling for the hearing, and more efficient ALJs. OAH has eliminated as many expenses as possible to address the decrease in billable hours. At the end of the year, OAH eliminated Westlaw, research software, and a program called Logikcull, which transcribes hearings. OAH does not intend to fill the FTE vacated by Director Dawson's retirement and will handle as many hearings as possible with our permanent, full-time ALJs to cut down on the cost of the contract ALJs. Because OAH is funded by special funds, it is dependent on a sufficient caseload to cover our expenses. In a span of eight years, our caseload had decreased by over 200 cases, causing funding to be an ongoing concern.






CONTRACT ALJS:

The Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) currently contracts with four part-time administrative law judges (CALJs). OAH assigns cases to the CALJs on an as-needed basis, so they are not guaranteed cases or work. The CALJs primarily handle Workforce Safety and Insurance (WSI) hearings but have been utilized for other hearings when needed.

OAH bills the requesting agency or entity for the CALJs' time at the same rate as the full-time, permanent ALJs. OAH then pays the CALJs according to an hourly rate which is contracted biennially. Below is a history of OAH's rate, OAH's contracted CALJ rate, and the difference, which OAH deems an overhead rate:



For the current biennium, OAH budgeted \$1,243,122 for CALJs' expenses and has used \$222,736 to date, for a remaining balance of \$1,020,386.

CASH BALANCE:

OAH is funded entirely through special funds which are generated by billing requesting agencies or entities for OAH services. OAH can carry forward any balance at the end of the biennium. Historically, OAH has maintained a comfortable cash balance. More recently, the cash balance has been used to meet our operating expenses caused by a decrease in billable hours. Below is the history of OAH's cash balance from June 2020 to present:

As a follow-up to one of the questions at the January 13, 2025, hearing, for the years 1991 through 1997, OAH was funded by both special funds and general funds. In 1997, OAH was modified to special funds only, but OAH was authorized for a general fund loan up to \$100,000. For the 1999-2001 biennium, the authorized general fund loan was increased to \$150,000.

OAH plans to handle as much of its caseload with the permanent, full-time ALJs as possible. Since OAH does not currently plan to fill the open permanent ALJFTE, the CALJs will be necessary to meet demand should OAH see a drastic increase in case requests.

SALARY BREAKDOWN:

Of the \$3,029,082 appropriation, \$1,446,690 is budgeted for salaries and wages for 5 FTEs, including 3 ALJs. Salaries and wages include the following:

The mission of the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) is to conduct orderly, fair, and impartial hearings and to issue prompt, reasoned recommended or final decisions. If a person receives a benefit or license from the state, the person is entitled to a hearing under the Due Process Clause of the Constitution. OAH provides substantive due process by deciding justly with well-reasoned decisions in accordance with the law. OAH also provides procedural due process by providing a neutral and unbiased tribunal that is independent from the governmental entity that provides the benefit or license. OAH listens to both sides of a dispute and allows each party the right to present evidence and cross-examine the other party's evidence. If the governmental entity that provides the benefit or license were to make the determination, there is the perception of bias. OAH provides experienced, professional, and neutral judges.

The prior director, Tim Dawson, retired on January 3, 2025. OAH currently has two fulltime administrative law judges (ALJs) - Jessica Binder, who started with our office in July 2021; and myself, who started in November 2018. OAH has two additional FTEs – our office manager Frances Zuther and administrative assistant Louise Wetzel. OAH also contracts with four part-time, as-needed ALJs. The contracted ALJs primarily handle Workforce Safety and Insurance (WSI) hearings. Three of these ALJs work out of Fargo and one works out of Bismarck.

The full-time, permanent ALJs conduct a mixture of agency hearings but, primarily, Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Public Service Commission (PSC), Workforce Safety and Insurance (WSI), Human Resource Management Services - state employee grievance hearings, and occupational licensing hearings. For 2024, I, Judge Hogan, had primarily a workload of WSI and PSC hearings. The other two fulltime ALJs conducted mainly DHHS hearings and other agency hearings. Since Director Dawson's retirement, we have not filled his vacated FTE. We will continue with two fulltime ALJs for the time being. Workload considerations and the need for the replacement of contract ALJs may require new contract ALJs at some time in the future if caseloads increase. Another option to handle additional caseload would be for OAH to employ more fulltime permanent ALJs. Currently, OAH is authorized for three permanent ALJs.

CASELOAD:

OAH conducts hearings for:

- State and local agencies and entities that are required to use OAH (see N.D.C.C.
 §§ 54-57-03(1), 40-51.2-12, 40-47-01.1, and 15.1-15-08);
- State agencies that voluntarily use OAH, such as the PSC, the Insurance Department, the Industrial Commission, the Department of Water Resources, colleges and universities for personnel hearings, UND Title IX hearings, and occasionally Job Service North Dakota for conflict unemployment compensation hearings; and
- Local entities such as cities or counties that voluntarily use OAH to conduct certain hearings such as employee discipline.

Over the years, OAH has conducted hearings for over 100 different state and local government agencies or entities. Some agencies make many requests each year, while others have made only a few requests since OAH was established. The table below shows the number of requests OAH has received per year for the last nine years:

For calendar year 2023, 27 different agencies or entities made 446 requests for hearing. For calendar year 2024, 22 different agencies or entities made 499 requests for hearing. Combined, OAH had 945 requested hearings from 34 different agencies or entities. *See* Attachment "A." This was an increase from the prior two years (2021 and 2022) where OAH had 768 requested hearings from 39 different agencies or entities.

For the first 20 months of this biennium (July 1, 2023, through February 28, 2025), 27 different agencies or entities have made 782 requests for hearing. *See* Attachment "B." As you can see from the attachments, the bulk of requests for hearing have come from two agencies, DHHS and WSI, which is typical for most biennia. Another increasingly frequent OAH user in the last few years is the PSC. OAH has also started conducting Title IX hearings for the University of North Dakota.

OAH does not hold a hearing for every request made. Some cases settle prior to hearing; some requests are withdrawn or abandoned; and on occasion, matters are disposed of by prehearing motion. Attachment "C" shows the number of hearings held for calendar years 2023 and 2024. Approximately 65 percent of hearing requests went to hearing. In the previous two years (2021 and 2022), 66 percent of the hearing requests went to hearing. Historically, between 45 percent and 55 percent of hearings requested go to hearing.

While not for all cases, OAH routinely holds prehearing conferences. This is an opportunity to confer with the parties prior to the hearing; answer questions or address concerns; and pick a hearing date, location, and prehearing deadlines. Prehearing conferences are usually held for more complex cases. For calendar years 2023 and 2024, 341 prehearing conferences were held which was down slightly from 387 for calendar years

2021 and 2022. *See* Attachment "D." OAH holds prehearing conferences for approximately 36 percent of hearing requests.

As our caseload evolves, another way to gauge our activity is to review billable hours. The table below shows total billable hours for OAH for the past four years:

Attachment "E" shows a breakdown of billable hours by agency. As you can see, our billable hours for DHHS have remained steady and have rebounded since COVID, but our billable hours for WSI cases are down significantly.

BUDGET:

- The OAH budget is funded completely through special funds and with no federal funds.
- OAH has a continuing appropriation under North Dakota Century Code Section 54-57-07.
- The OAH budget has little to no change from last biennium.
- The OAH budget is two lines; one for salaries and benefits for 5 FTEs and one for operating. Of the operating line, 78 percent is to pay contract ALJs for work completed, 7 percent for IT, and 5.7 percent for office space.
- OAH charges an hourly fee for its service to the requesting entities. The rate of \$215 per hour has been in place since July 1, 2023. As of January 2025, the rate was

increased to account for the decrease in billable hours. OAH contract with WSI, so the rate for WSI will not increase until the state of the next biennium.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS AND CHALLENGES

• **WSI Case Processing.** Under N.D.C.C. § 54-57-09, OAH is required to track processing time of WSI cases. The goal is to average 215 days or less from the date the case is received by OAH to the date the decision issued. OAH must track this on a monthly, rolling six-month average. OAH has adopted case processing standards to meet this goal. OAH reports to the state advisory council each quarter.

Attachment "F" shows the rolling average for the current biennium. OAH has reduced the average number of days to process a case from 290 to around 160 days. This is a reduction of at least 130 days or about 45 percent and is below the goal of under 215 days.

• **Conducting Hearings.** With CARES Act money, OAH equipped its hearing rooms with equipment to conduct hearings by video conferences and improved audio recording equipment to help facilitate these hearings. OAH conducts remote hearings when requested using this technology.

OAH also conducts in-person hearings both in OAH hearing rooms and in remote locations across the state. In-person hearings are common for WSI hearings and cases concerning professional licensure matters and parental rights. Sometimes a hearing involves credibility issues. It is advantageous to judge demeanor and credibility when hearing testimony is face-to-face. OAH also conducts in-person hearings for complex cases or when requested by the parties. Being able to talk directly to the ALJ reflects well on the accessibility of government, and this value exceeds the increased cost and inconvenience to the ALJ and agency involved.

- OAH continues to explore other ways to incorporate technology and make our office more accessible. One priority is to adopt procedures for electronic filing.
- **Funding.** Our biggest current challenge is funding. While our 2024 hearing requests increased by 53, our billable time decreased by 327.5 hours. There are many reasons for the decrease in billable hours such as:
 - An increase in the number of cases that settle:
 - Many DHHS cases generate only a few billable hours per case;
 - More hearings being held by video conference versus traveling for the hearing; and
 - More efficient ALJs.

OAH has eliminated as many expenses as possible to address the decrease in billable hours. At the end of the year, OAH eliminated our research software, Westlaw, and a program called Logikcull which transcribes hearings. For the time being, OAH will not fill the open FTE vacated by Director Dawson's retirement and will handle as many hearings as possible with our permanent, fulltime ALJs to cut down on the cost of the contract ALJs. Because OAH is funded by special funds, it is dependent on a sufficient caseload to cover our expenses. Our billable hours have decreased from 7,972.8 hours in 2018 to 4,208.3 hours in 2024, a change of 3,764.5 hours.

CASH BALANCE:


OAH can carry forward a cash balance at the end of the biennium. Historically, OAH has maintained a comfortable cash balance. More recently, the cash balance has been used to meet our operating expenses caused by the decrease in billable hours. The history of OAH's cash balance from June 2020 to present is found in Attachment "G." As of the end of February 2025, OAH has a negative cash balance.

For the years 1991 through 1997, OAH was funded by both special funds and general funds. In 1997, OAH's funding was modified to special funds only, but OAH was authorized for a general fund loan up to \$100,000. For the 1999-2001 biennium, the authorized general fund loan was increased to \$150,000. The language of that appropriation was as follows:

1997 SB 2018, Section 2 reads:

SECTION 2. OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE HEARINGS - LOAN FROM **APPROPRIATION** STATE **GENERAL FUND** OF LOAN **REPAYMENT.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the office of administrative hearings is authorized to borrow up to \$100,000, which amounts are hereby appropriated from the state general fund during the biennium, beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1999. The office of administrative hearings shall inform the office of management and budget of any loan required pursuant to this section. Any loan made to the office of administrative hearings under this section must be repaid to the state general fund by June 30, 1999, and any loan repayments made by the office of administrative hearings are hereby appropriated for the biennium beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1999.

It is estimated that by not filling the open ALJ FTE we will recover slowly. However, OAH is dependent on case requests. It's impossible to forecast case requests, thus we have ongoing funding concerns. Similar to 1997 SB 2018, OAH would propose an amendment to SB 2017 to authorize OAH to take a line-of-credit to cover any deficiency. OAH would propose a line-of-credit from the Bank of North Dakota rather than a general fund loan. OAH would also propose authority for the line-of-credit to continue into the next biennium to ensure OAH does not have a deficient balance at the end of the biennium.






