Chairman Patten, and members of the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee, I am Andrew Nygren, the Water Appropriation Division Director of the Department of Water Resources (Department). I'm here today to provide testimony in support of SB 2059.

Section 1 of the bill before you today focuses on clarifying how the Department of Water Resources notifies people about hearings related to conditional water permit applications. There are two situations where a hearing might happen.

First, when the Department decides to hold a public hearing to gather more input on a water permit application. The bill clarifies the Department will notify the necessary parties about the time and place of the hearing using certified mail. The present language states the service under the ND Rules of Civil Procedure.

The other situation is when someone requests an adjudicative proceeding to challenge the Department's recommendation on a water permit application, like a recommendation to approve a permit. The bill ensures the same notification process applies here, with certified mail used to inform the required parties about the time and place of the proceeding.
