- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subdivision xx of subsection 2 of section 12-60-24 of the North

 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

 Xx. The office of state treasurer for each individual an applicant or employee who has
 - xx. The office of state treasurer for each individual an applicant or employee who has access to federal tax information under chapter 54-11-16.
 - **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-11-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 54-11-16. Criminal history record checks.
 - The state treasurer shall require any applicant, or employee, or independent contractor who has access to federal tax information to submit to a statewide and nationwide criminal history record check, and subsequent recheck within tenfive years from the date of the previous criminal history record check. The nationwide criminal history record check must be conducted in the manner provided by section 12-60-24.

a. The office of state treasurer for each individual <u>any applicant or employee</u> who has access to federal tax information <u>under chapter 54-11-16</u>.

Chairman Roers,

Before you is SB 2073, a bill that amends NDCC 54-11-16 regarding the background check provisions for the Office of the State Treasurer.

Our office has this requirement primarily due to our involvement in processing and handling federal tax information and to be in compliance with the IRS and publication 1075 (Rev. 11-2021) Section 2.C.3. Due to federal requirements related to this information as it relates to the Office of State Treasurer's daily duties, we must follow the federal guidelines. Those guidelines have been adjusted and they shortened the period for rechecking employees from 10 years to 5, and this bill seeks to codify that.

After the bill was introduced, I was approached by BCI about an amendment. As you can see in bottom of this bill in the existing code, this section references NDCC 12-60-24, which is BCI's chapter. BCI manages the background check process for the state. In talking with them, they've advised that the FBI is being more stringent in the actual wording utilized in code, and have recommended a technical correction to our current language to make it conform with their updated framework. I've included those amendments to my testimony and ask this committee to adopt those as well.

Before you is SB 2073, a bill dealing with the background check provisions for the Office of the State Treasurer.

Our office has this requirement primarily due to our involvement in processing and handling child support payments. Due to federal requirements around the information that could be included in this process, we must follow the federal guidelines. Those guidelines have been adjusted and they shortened the period for rechecking employees from 10 years to 5, and this bill seeks to codify that.

The bill before you adjusts our existing background check provisions for two sections of century code. Section 1 of the bill modifies the language as it exists within BCl's section of the century code. Every agency in North Dakota that does these checks uses BCl and is listed in this area of code. Section 2 of this bill modifies this language within the State Treasurer's chapter of the century code.
