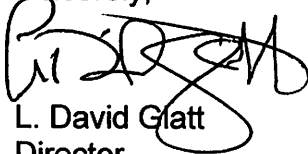

FULL NOTICE OF INTENT TO
AMEND ADMINISTRATIVE RULES
RELATING TO AIR POLLUTION CONTROL

TAKE NOTICE that the North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality (“Department”) will hold a public hearing to address proposed amendments to North Dakota Administrative Code Article 33.1-15 at the following time and location:

The purpose of the proposed rule amendments is to comply with federal law. As a requirement of North Dakota maintaining an EPA-authorized Lead-Based Paint Program, the State of North Dakota is required to adopt rules that are compatible with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) rules.

On November 12, 2024, the EPA published a final rule to revise the dust-lead hazard standards (DLHS) and dust-lead clearance levels (DLCL) to better protect children from lead exposure. The final rule revised the DLHS from 10 micrograms per square foot ($\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$) for floors and 100 $\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$ for window sills to any reportable level as analyzed by a laboratory recognized by EPA’s National Lead Laboratory Accreditation Program (NLLAP), and lowered the DLCL from 10 $\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$, 100 $\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$ and 400 $\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$ for floors, window sills, and window troughs to 5 $\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$, 40 $\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$, and 100 $\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$, respectively.

The EPA also finalized other amendments to EPA’s Lead-Based Paint Program such as revising the terminology of the DLHS to dust-lead reportable levels (DLRL) and DLCL to dust-lead action levels (DLAL). The rule also aligns the definition of target housing with the statute, finalized changes to the definition of abatement so that action is recommended when levels are at or above the DLAL, and finalized revisions to the definition of child-occupied facilities and related regulatory language to establish consistency in age throughout the Lead-Based Paint regulations.

As a result of these changes to the EPA rules, there are some changes/updates required to North Dakota Administrative Code Article 33.1-15. The proposed amendments address the following:

EPA Section

§ 40 CFR Part 745
(Lead-Based Paint Poisoning
Prevention in Certain Residential
Structures)

State Section

§ 33.1-15-24
(Standards for Lead-Based Paint
Activities)

The proposed rule amendments are not expected to have an impact on the regulated community in the excess of \$50,000.
